

East Norriton Township - Special Public Meeting
February 9, 2011

The Special Meeting of the Board of Supervisors of East Norriton Township was called to order by the Chairwoman, Karen "Kandy" Heckman, at 12:05 p.m. on Wednesday, February 9, 2011, at the Township Municipal Building. Supervisors present were Karen "Kandy" Heckman, Donald J. Gracia, Harris A. Dainoff and James J. Serratore, III. John A. Zurzola was absent.

Following roll call, the Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all in attendance.

The Chairwoman asked Township Solicitor Christen Pionzio to review the purpose of this special Public Meeting. Mrs. Pionzio stated the purpose is the consideration of Resolution 2533 which establishes what is described as a "Self Cure". This Curative Amendment would provide protection for the Township by declaring a portion of the Code unconstitutional relative to the size limitation of billboards that is in the Township's Zoning Ordinance. The Curative Amendment would be available for consideration at the next regular meeting on February 22, 2011.

Mr. Serratore made a motion to approve Resolution No. 2533. The motion was then seconded by Mr. Dainoff. Upon requesting any comments, Mr. Nick Viglianese of 3105 Whitehall Rd. asked if this resolution would stop the fight the Township currently is involved in. The Solicitor replied that it is only for protection against future challenges. Mr. Ken Christovich of 2937 Tanglewood Lane asked what this applicant specifically wants that is not covered in our Sign codes. Solicitor Pionzio stated that the applicant wants to install billboards which are very large being 14 ft by 48ft and as high as 29ft in height and are digital. Ms. Deborah Knawby of 3100 N. Wales Rd. stated that she is personally in favor of all obstacles that could prevent more companies from installing

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these billboards. As there were no other comments, the Chairwoman asked for a vote and Resolution No. 2533 was approved unanimously.

There being no other business to come before the Board, the Chairwoman asked if there were any citizens to be heard with no response.

Mr. Gracia made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 12:30 p.m. the motion was seconded by Mr. Dainoff and approved unanimously.
