
The inaugural run was held last year as a part of the 4th of July events scheduled with East and West Norriton

Spring Leaf Collection

In compliance with state regulations, East Norriton Township will provide leaf collection services again this spring. **These collections will be performed during the 2-week period between April 26th and May 7th.**

Unlike the fall leaf collection program, this is a modified collection schedule and will be bag collection only (**bio-degradable paper bags only**). All bagged leaves must be placed at the curb along your property. In addition, the spring leaf collection program will be a **CALL-IN-SERVICE ONLY!** You must call the Township offices at (610) 275-2800 ext.111 to schedule a pick-up. All calls must be received by Wednesday, May 5th.

Please be aware that only raked leaves should be placed in bio-degradable bags. Any bags containing cut-up/mulched leaves, limbs, brush, grass clippings or other debris will not be collected. **This is separate from the Yard Waste Recycling Program.** Please refer to the Yard Waste Recycling Program article in this newsletter for details about that program.


Yard Waste Recycling

To effectively meet the solid waste and recycling needs of the community, the Township continues to offer Yard Waste Recycling services to our residents. This service should not be confused with the Leaf Collection program as they are 2 separate collection services performed by the township. As a reminder, listed below are key aspects of the Yard Waste Recycling program.

- Collections take place on the **3rd Thursday of each month**
- Residents **must call** the Township 610-275-2800 x111 schedule collection **at least 7 days in advance**
- **Includes** shrubbery, branches, bundled limbs and garden residue
- **Not included** are stumps, weeds, grass or leaves
- **Everything** must be bundled or placed in 32 gallon cans and placed within 5 ft. of curb with cut ends facing street (*not in the street*)
- **Limits:** bundles – max 2 ft. dia. and/or 40 lbs.; individual branches – max 5 in. dia.
- **Quantity limits:** 2 c.y. per property per collection day (*approximately ten 32 gallon cans or six bundles of material*)
- Materials not properly prepared (*in plastic bags, unacceptable materials, etc.*) or excessive quantities of materials will not be collected.

NORRITON FIRE ENGINE COMPANY REPORT



New Tower Ladder Fire Truck

The Norriton Fire Engine Company received its new EONE 100' Ladder Tower fire truck, "Tower 61". The fire truck arrived at the sub-station on Germantown Pike and Whitehall roads on Friday February 5th, 2010. On hand to meet its arrival were the East Norriton Township Supervisors, Manager and Assistant Manager, Staff, NFEC Apparatus Committee, Fire Department members, family and friends.

After 2 years of extensive research of numerous fire truck manufacturers and the needs of the township, the NFEC Apparatus committee presented the specifications and together with the approval of the East Norriton Township Board of Supervisors, purchased the new Ladder Tower fire truck. The new Ladder Tower fire truck was manufactured in Ocala, Florida by the EONE Company and replaces an aging Tower Ladder and a Engine fire truck.

The new 100' Ladder Tower platform is rated for 1000-lbs. of personnel plus 305-lbs. of equipment making Tower 61 beneficial to our township residents and businesses especially those in high rise apartments and commercial facilities where roof access is critical in the expediting and deployment of the rapid response of fire personnel for commercial and residential rescue.



Cub Scouts Visit Norriton Fire Engine Company

Norriton Fire Engine Company hosted a Cub Scout Visit on January 26th with 20 Cub Scouts, Cub Scout Leaders, and Family members from Cub Scout Packs 622 and 724. The Cub Scout Packs are currently working towards their Safety Protection Badges and with the help of the fire department they were instructed in the areas of Family Fire Planning, along with a demonstration of Firefighting equipment, Stop... Drop... and Roll exercises, and a tour of the fire station. A question and answer session ended the evening with snacks and beverages and the distribution of Fire Safety materials for the Cub Scouts to take home to use as a reference for their project.

Three Students to Represent East Norriton at United Games of Nations 2010 in Berlin

At a meeting of the East Norriton Township/Treptow-Köpenick Committee on Thursday, January 21, committee members approved the participation of three local students in the 2010 United Games of Nations. Every summer, East Norriton's sister city, Treptow-Köpenick, hosts the Games for a period of one week for young people aged 15 to 23. The United Games Germany 2010 will be held during the period from June 14 to June 20.

The East Norriton students who will be welcomed by Mayor Gabrielle Schöttler in June will be Marybeth O'Connor, a junior at Norristown Area High School, and her sister, Cathryn O'Connor, a sophomore at Norristown High and John Brumbaugh, a Kutztown University sophomore, who was a student at East Norriton Middle School and a 2008 graduate of LaSalle College High School. The three students were all termed "excellent candidates" by members of the committee. Although John Brumbaugh attended the United Games in 2009 as an individual, this is the first year that East Norriton is sending an official, but small, contingent to represent the United States at the United Games. But they, in turn, may be able to help John, when it comes to communicating with representatives from another of T-K's eleven sister cities, Cajamarca, Peru, who will also be attending. In addition, T-K expects about 150 participants from almost 20 countries to take part in the games in Berlin this summer.

Sewer Bill Update

First quarter sewer bills are mailed on March 31, 2010. This bill is for water consumption for the periods September, October and November 2009. Second quarter sewer bills will be mailed June 30, 2010 and will cover the water consumption period of December 2009, January and February 2010.

Tax Collection

For the year 2010, East Norriton Township's Real Estate Tax millage rate is 2.727 mills Montgomery County's Real Estate Tax millage rate is 2.695 mills and are based on "Market Value" assessments which took effect in 1998.

East Norriton Township also levies an Earned Income Tax which is collected by Berkheimer Associates. The final 2009 Earned Income Tax returns were mailed in January 2010 and are due April 15, 2010. We again want to thank the residents of East Norriton Township for conscientiously paying your Earned Income Taxes.





SUMMER PLAYGROUND PROGRAM 2010

GENERAL INFORMATION

The East Norriton Township Parks and Recreation Department will open its 2010 Summer Playground program on Monday, June 21st and continue for six weeks until Friday, July 30th. This program is designed for East Norriton Township youths ages 5-13. A wide variety of activities is offered for the participants to partake in, such as arts and crafts, sports, games, contests, special events, and field trips. Anyone planning to participate on a trip must have a filled out permission slip accompanied with payment turned into your counselor by the prescribed deadline. A flyer on each trip will be distributed at the playgrounds, listing departure and return times, fees, etc. for your review. Parents and other family members are invited to join us on any of our trips or special events. All non-registered youths must be accompanied by an adult. Rates for non-registered guests are available upon request.

The playground program operates Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. - 3 p.m. with the exception of Monday, July 5th and trip days. All staff members are required to supervise the participants on scheduled trips, therefore **no playground will be conducted at the Paul Fly playground on trip days** unless otherwise noted. This year's summer camp will once again be operating from the Paul Fly Elementary School. Flyers and a playground syllabus will be available the first day of camp to assist you and your child in planning for the summer's activities.

Our playground program is designed for an active/passive group learning experience for the participants. Therefore, children must be 5 years old prior to the start of camp. All new participants are required to provide a copy of their birth certificate for proof of age. Our hours are 9 a.m. - 3 p.m.; it is imperative that all participants are picked up at the designated time. Our staff has other commitments to attend to after playground hours. FROM THE FIRE MARSHAL

The Fire Marshal's Office would like to remind residents to review the following items prior to and during the upcoming spring and summer seasons:

1. Keep all high brush/weeds cut and away from your home or business.
2. Keep all combustibles away from home and or businesses.
3. Store all flammable liquids and gases (gasoline and propane) away from any ignition source and away from structures.
4. Keep vegetation from obscuring the view of fire hydrants.
5. Be sure to have a working smoke detector on every level of the home and in every bedroom. Also be sure to check your batteries and test your detectors each month.
6. Be sure to have working carbon monoxide detector on every level of the home.
7. Ensure that your address is clearly visible from the street.

Smoke Detector Distribution

A limited quantity of smoke detectors are available for distribution to East Norriton Township residents. Any resident needing smoke detectors or needing help installing smoke detectors should contact the Fire Marshal's Office. The smoke detectors are available at no cost to the residents of East Norriton Township and will be available while supplies last.

Barbeque Safety

The Fire Marshal's Office would like the residents to keep in mind the following safety precautions when it comes to barbeque grills and outdoor cooking.

1. **ABSOLUTELY NO BARBEQUES SHOULD BE USED ON BALCONIES OR COVERED PORCHES.**
2. Keep grills 10 feet away from any structure or any combustible materials.
3. If using charcoal grills, be sure to completely extinguish hot coals and **DO NOT** dispose of hot coals in the trash.
4. Properly store your propane cylinders and inspect them for any defects before use.

Chimineas and Portable Outdoor Fireplaces

Portable outdoor fireplaces (chimineas) are now regulated in accordance with the 2009 International Fire Code. Portable outdoor fireplaces shall be used in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions and shall not be operated within **15 feet of a structure** or combustible material.

The use of portable outdoor fireplace must be constantly attended until the fire is extinguished. A minimum of one

portable fire extinguisher complying with a minimum "4-A" rating or other approved on-site fire-extinguishing equipment, such as dirt, sand, or garden hose shall be available for immediate use. Open burning of trash, rubbish, grass or leaves is prohibited.

Construction Update

Einstein Hospital: The Board of Supervisors granted conditional final approval to Albert Einstein Healthcare Network's land development plans in May of 2009. Einstein proposes the construction a hospital and medical office building on the Wood's Golf Center property and has since submitted final land development plans for review. The developer is working to fulfill all of the conditions of their land development approval. Groundbreaking is expected in May or June of 2010 with and anticipated completion date in 2012.

MESSAGE FROM THE CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICE

Unlicensed and Inoperable Vehicles: This is message to alert all residents that vehicles parked on private or public properties with expired registration and/or inspection are strictly prohibited. Such vehicles cannot be parked on the street or on private property including residential driveways. If the Township becomes aware of any covered vehicles showing no sign of movement, the owner of the property may be contacted in order to confirm that the vehicle has a valid registration and inspection.

Improper storage of unlicensed and inoperable vehicles can be a detriment to our community. These unsightly vehicles clutter the neighborhood, contribute to blight, provide harborage for rodents and act as an attractive nuisance for children. In addition, the location of these unused vehicles could quite possibly interfere with the operation of emergency service vehicles.
