EAST NORRITON RESIDENTS ENCOURAGED TO SIGN-UP FOR BLACKBOARD CONNECT

East Norriton residents are reminded that East Norriton Township has been utilizing Blackboard Connect for about two years to notify residents of emergencies, and upcoming public events. Each

message sent by the Township reaches nearly 5,700 resident's phone numbers, 234 e-mails and 124 texts. The Township also utilizes this system to notify our businesses of important information. About 920 businesses can also receive these important messages. You can set up your own account through Blackboard Connect to manage how you want to receive your notifications (phone, e-mail or text) and to add or change phone numbers or add your e-mail account. A link to Blackboard Connect for East Norriton Township users is located on our home page of our web site, www.eastnorritontwp.org under the current Township Newsletter link. To date, we have about 300 residents who have set up their own account to add or change phone numbers and the ability to set preferences on how to receive the different type of messages. The site has been used for snow emergencies, road closures, special public safety announcements and notification about upcoming programs and special events sponsored by the Township.



LITTER ALERT - RECYCLABLE MATERIALS

The Township has been experiencing a dilemma where uncovered recycling containers are placed at the curb for pick-up and the recyclable items in those containers are scattered by the wind and littered into the streets and onto other private properties. Please note that this is a prohibited act and the property owner of the recycling container is in violation of the township code with a potential fine up to \$600. Specifically, the code states:

"It shall be unlawful for any person, partnership, association or corporation to discard, dump, abandon, deposit, throw, scatter or cast off any waste materials, filth, dirt, rubbish, ashes, junk, garbage or any other unclean matter, so as to endanger the health, cleanliness, comfort and safety of the citizens within said Township, in or upon any public highway or public or private property, vacant or occupied,

within the Township of East Norriton."

Please be considerate of your community and your neighbors and take the appropriate action to prevent this from happening. Trash companies are now offering totes with a lid for your recyclable materials. We would encourage you to contact your trash hauler and request a covered recycling tote. If that is not an option, please consider using a container that has a lid for your recyclables. Also, please spend an extra minute to pick up any missed or dropped items from your recycling hauler. We all have to work together to keep our community clean and litter free.

East Norriton Township, West Norriton Township and the municipality of Norristown will be holding the 7th Annual Celebration 5K run on Saturday, July 4th, 2015. Run will start at the Norristown High School cross Whitehall Road, continue along the path of the Norristown Farm Park and return to the High School. The run will commence at 8:30 a.m. with registrations and check-in starting at 7:00 a.m.

Sewer Billing Update

First quarter sewer bills covering water consumption for December, January, and February will be mailed by April 1st. Second quarter sewer bills covering water consumption for March, April, and May will be mailed by July 1st.

Sewer Direct Debit Program

How would you like to stop writing checks to pay your sewer bills, save postage and avoid late fees? You can do all that through our **DIRECT DEBIT** program!

Over 250 sewer customers have already signed up for this program. This payment option debits your checking or savings account to automatically pay your sewer bill when it is due. Payments are deducted from your account on the 23rd each month a bill is due. If the 23rd is not a business day, the payments will be debited on the next business day. There is **no cost to customers** to use this service. You can download the authorization form from the Township's website.

Tax Collection

For 2015, East Norriton Township's Real Estate Tax millage rate remained 2.727 mills, and Montgomery County's Real Estate Tax millage rate remained to 3.152 mills. Taxes are based on the assessed value as determined by the Montgomery County Board of Assessment. The discount period for property taxes ends on May 1st and the face period ends on July 1st. Taxes can be paid by mail, at the Township building, online through the Township's website, or at the East Norriton Continental Bank located at 113 West Germantown Pike. Please note tax payments will no longer be accepted at the East Norriton Citizen's Bank.


The Board of Supervisors of East Norriton Township adopted an annual budget for the 2015 calendar year in December 2014. A summary of the adopted budget is as follows:

The weather will soon be changing and our kids will be getting outside to play more. Help us keep you safe by protecting yourself first.

Keep Our Kids Safe:

Parents/Adults

- 1) School will soon be closed for the summer, and children will be at play. Use extra caution when driving in neighborhoods and near playgrounds.
- 2) Summer temperatures are high. Don't leave children and pets in cars unattended.
- 3) Going on vacation? Consider letting the police know and file a vacation notice. Officers will check your residence while you're away.



Children (bicycle safety)

- 1) Never ride out into a street without stopping first.
- 2) Obey stop signs.
- 3) Check behind before turning, swerving, or changing lanes.
- 4) Never follow another rider without applying the rules.
- 5) Before you get on your bike, put on a helmet!

Crime Prevention Tips

We have seen several scams occurring throughout Montgomery County. The most common have been internet and phone scams. It is currently difficult, if not impossible to investigate and prosecute both internet and telephone crimes because they are so intertwined in today's technology. Help protect yourself and don't be a victim by following these simple steps:

- 1.) Do not assume a credible-looking web site is credible. Anyone can create a web site that looks legitimate.
- 2.) If it seems too good to be true, it probably is. Call an Officer, a trusted family member or friend and run it by them.
- 3.) Be cautious of unsolicited e-mails and phone calls -many are fraudulent.
- 4.) Be wary of anyone who asks for personal information. Do not give out any information to a person, business or web site you have not verified with a reputable source.
- 5.) Your Social Security number should not be necessary unless you are applying for credit. Do not give it out.
- 6.) Be suspicious of anyone who contacts you and claims to be from a company with whom you have an account like a bank, credit card or phone company. If they ask for information that the business already has, do not give it to them. Call the company independently, using the contact information on your statement or from the official Web site.



- 7.) **Do not respond to offers that demand you act immediately or won't take "no" for an answer.**

8.) Do not open e-mail attachments from unfamiliar sources. They could contain malicious programs designed to steal your personal information.

9.) Watch out for pop-up windows asking you to enter in financial data. Legitimate companies won't require you to submit sensitive information this way.

10.) Keep your computer protected. Having anti-virus software is great, but you also need anti-spam and spyware protection to keep scams and computer intruders at bay. Utilize and update your firewall.

Distraction Burglaries

We have seen several distraction burglaries. For residents who have not heard of them, distraction burglaries involve multiple actors who may be communicating by cell phone or walkie-talkie. One or two actors may distract homeowners by pretending to do work on their home or even somewhere else in the area; some have even pretended to be with utility companies.

While the homeowner is distracted by conversation, being showed around the property, another actor who is often unseen by the resident will enter the home looking for valuables. Protect yourself from these types of crime beginning when you hear a knock at the door by thinking:

Are you expecting anyone?

- If someone is claiming to be from a company remember to ask what it is they are there for.
- Always ask for an ID or any associated paperwork – get them to pass these through the letter box as at this point you should still have your door closed.
- If you have any doubt you should ring the company they say they are from independently. Never ring the number given by the caller but instead locate it from another source e.g. phone book or directory enquiries.

Additional Measures:

- Ensure that your back door is always closed when answering the door. Caller's intent on gaining access to your property may be working in pairs – while one distracts you at your front door the other may be trying to enter your property via the back.
- Never keep large sums of money in the house – use a bank or building society if possible.
- Keep valuables and items of sentimental value where they are not easily accessible – the use of a small safe might be appropriate.
- Keep documents containing personal details out of sight e.g. passport, utility bills, bank statements etc.
- Make sure you keep your keys in a safe place and not on display.

When to call the police:

- If you are suspicious or feel that the caller may be phony.
- If someone forces entry or enters your home without permission.
- You notice valuables or money have gone missing shortly after someone has visited.
- Whenever you think a crime has been, or is about to be committed.

A MESSAGE FROM THE FIRE MARSHAL

Every year Americans look forward to summer vacations, camping, family reunions, picnics, and the Fourth of July. Summertime, however, also brings fires and injuries due to fireworks and outdoor grills. Annually just under 10,000 Americans are injured by fireworks and almost 5,000 are injured by charcoal/wood-burning and propane grill fires. In 2007, 64 percent of fireworks injuries occurred between June 22 and July 22.



Families also enjoy camping in the summer. It is important to follow the park's rules for the use and extinguishing of campfires.

Summertime should be a time for fun and making happy memories. Knowing a few fire safety tips and following instructions will help everyone have a safe summer.



Fireworks Safety

- The best way to enjoy fireworks is to visit public fireworks displays put on by professionals who know how to safely handle fireworks.
- If you plan to use fireworks, make sure they are legal in your area.
- Never light fireworks indoors or near dry grass.
- Always have a bucket of water and/or a fire extinguisher nearby. Know how to operate the fire extinguisher properly.
- Do not wear loose clothing while using fireworks.
- Stand several feet away from lit fireworks. If a device does not go off, do not stand over it to investigate it. Put it out with water and dispose of it.
- Always read the directions and warning labels on fireworks. If a device is not marked with the contents, direction and a warning label, do not light it.
- Supervise children around fireworks at all times.

Barbecue Safety

- Before using a grill, check the connection between the propane tank and the fuel line. Make sure the venturi tubes - where the air and gas mix - are not blocked.
- Do not overfill the propane tank.
- Do not wear loose clothing while cooking at a barbecue.
- Be careful when using lighter fluid. Do not add fluid to an already lit fire because the flame can flashback up into the container and explode.
- Keep all matches and lighters away from children. Teach your children to report any loose matches or lighters to an adult immediately. Supervise children around outdoor grills.
- Dispose of hot coals properly - douse them with plenty of water,



and stir them to ensure that the fire is out. Never place them in plastic, paper or wooden containers.


- Never grill/barbecue in enclosed areas - carbon monoxide could be produced.
- Make sure everyone knows to Stop, Drop and Roll in case a piece of clothing does catch fire. Call 911 if a burn warrants serious medical attention.

Campfire Safety

- Build campfires where they will not spread, away from dry grass and leaves.
- Keep campfires small, and don't let them get out of hand.
- Keep plenty of water and a shovel around to douse the fire when you're done. Stir it and douse it again with water.
- Never leave campfires unattended.

Smoke Detector Distribution

Limited quantities of smoke detectors are available for distribution to East Norriton Township residents. Any resident needing smoke detectors or help installing smoke detectors should contact the Fire Marshal's Office. The smoke detectors are available at no cost to the residents of East Norriton Township and will be available while supplies last.



Battery Storage Safety

Do you have 9V batteries rolling around loose in a kitchen junk drawer? If so, you should know that these batteries are capable of causing a fire if they come in contact with metallic objects in the drawer like paper clips, pen clips etc. The danger occurs when the metallic object touches both the positive and negative posts on the top of the battery, this will create the object to heat up and ignite a fire. Storing 9V batteries in a plastic bag with other batteries can also be dangerous. To store, keep in the original packaging or keep the ends covered. For disposal, make sure that the positive and negative posts are safely wrapped with electrical tape.

The shredding event will be held in the parking lot of the bocce courts at Stanbridge Street Park, 2501 Stanbridge Street, East Norriton, PA from 9 a.m. – 12 noon. The shredding event is being held to help lower the risk of identity theft. To keep the line moving, residents are asked to limit your time in line by only bringing two file boxes or three grocery bags of material to be shredded at a time. If you have additional material, you may get back in line to shred more items. Please make sure there are no plastic binders, black binder clips, DVD's or metal

included in your material. Paper clips and staples are okay. Plan to bring your unwanted and confidential papers to the Township Building to dispose of them in a safe and secure manner.

SPRING LEAF COLLECTION DATES & REMINDERS

WHAT: Vacuum collection of leaves only.
NO BAGGED LEAVES!

WHEN: 2-week period between April 20th & May 1st.

WHERE: Curbside collection of raked leaves on all Township owned streets. Residents who live along the busier streets in the Township (Germantown Pk, Dekalb Pk, Township Line, Swede, Whitehall, Trooper, and Burnside) are asked **not to rake your leaves into the street** as this can create a safety hazard to motorists.

HOW: SCHEDULED-SERVICE ONLY! Call the Township offices at (610) 275-2800 ext.111 or submit the form on our website to schedule a pick-up. All requests must be received by Wednesday, April 29th.

Please understand that this service is for leaves only! Any piles containing branches, limbs, brush, grass clippings or other debris will not be collected. **This is separate from the Yard Waste Recycling Program. Please refer to the Yard Waste Recycling Program article in this newsletter for details about that program.**



YARD WASTE RECYCLING ...REMINDER

Below is a list of program reminders. Your efforts in adhering to these guidelines are greatly appreciated and will ensure timely collection of your materials.

- **Collections are the 3rd Thursday of each month.** Please check your calendar for the dates.
- **Scheduled service:** Call 610-275-2800 x111 or submit the form on our website **at least 2 days in advance** to schedule collection.
- **Includes:** shrubbery, branches, limbs & garden residue.
- **Not included:** stumps, weeds, grass or leaves.
- **Placement:** within 5 ft. of curb (not in the street). Please do not block sidewalks.
- **Limits:** bundles – max 2 ft. dia. and/or 40 lbs.; individual branches – max 5 in. dia.
- **Quantity limits:** 2 cubic yards per property (approx. ten 32-gallon cans or six bundles).
- **Bundles:** smaller branches must be bundled. Bundled branches should be at least 3 ft. long. Smaller branches and twigs must be placed in cans.
- **Large Branches:** Larger branches (8 - 10ft. long) do not have to be bundled. Larger branches feed easily into chipper. No need to cut up. Just place cut end towards the street.
- **No No's:** plastic bags, heavy rope or wire (string or twine only); bundling small branches/twigs (less than 2 ft. long) as all of these practices "jam" the chipper and will not be collected.

Containers returned upon request.



Do Not Bring electronics, appliances, asbestos, explosives, ammunition, medical waste, radioactive waste, smoke detectors, items containing Freon, tires or the following:

Latex or Water-Based Paint is not hazardous and can be placed in the trash once it is dry. Air dry latex paint or add absorbent material like kitty litter until paint becomes a solid.

Alkaline Household Batteries are not hazardous and should be thrown in the trash.

Prescription Medications should be disposed of in the secure drop boxes located in many area police stations, a list of which can be found in the Recycling Guide at MontgomeryCountyRecycles.org.

Propane or Helium Tanks should be taken to locations listed in the Recycling Guide at MontgomeryCountyRecycles.org. Mini propane canisters are accepted at collections.






