## Dr. Theresa Carfagno Honored

In 1982, Dr. Carfagno received her Principals Certification and on August 1, 1985, she was appointed to the Principal's position at the Paul Fly Elementary School and served in that capacity through her retirement on June 30, 2007. During her tenure as Principal, the Paul Fly Elementary School was chosen as a National Blue Ribbon School of Excellence and the school met its No Child Left Behind Average Yearly Progress targets every year since the inception of the federal initiative. The Board of Supervisors recognized Dr. Carfagno at the regular monthly meeting in July and wishes her the best in her retirement.

## I&I Grant Presentation

At the July 24, 2007 Regular meeting, State Representative Jay Moyer presented a "mock" check in the amount of \$550,000 to East Norriton Township. This grant was obtained for the purpose of assisting with the funding of the sewer lateral I&I project in the west end of the Township. Property owners who are required to make repairs to their sewer laterals as part of the Consent Order and Agreement executed between the Township and the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection will be reimbursed between 50-60 percent of the actual cost of the repairs utilizing this grant funding. East Norriton Township thanks Representative Moyer for his assistance in securing this grant.

## IMPORTANT NOTICE

### 19403 Zip Code Changes

After being brought to our attention by residents, East Norriton Township has been trying to determine when and how all properties located within the 19403 zip code area have had their primary city designation changed to “Eagleville”. East Norriton Township worked hard to persuade the U.S. Postal Service to allow the use of “East Norriton” as an acceptable city designation within the 19403 and 19401 zip codes. However, without notification, the Postal Service appears to have changed the primary city designations for all 19403 properties. Although we have received some verbal confirmation, Township officials are trying to schedule meetings with Postal officials to resolve this matter and confirm that the use of “East Norriton” as the city designation is still permitted. As noted, we did receive verbal confirmation and continue to encourage all residents to use “East Norriton” as your city designation whether you live in the 19403 or 19401 zip codes.



## RECYCLING CORNER

East Norriton Township continues to support recycling efforts of the residents. The Township now has a new recycling trailer located at the municipal building in addition to the Abitibi container for the residents of East Norriton Township to use.

The Abitibi container (green and yellow) accepts newspapers, catalogs, magazines, junk mail, office paper, fax paper, notebooks and folders.

The new recycling trailer (blue) accepts all other recyclable materials including phonebooks, cardboard (cereal boxes, etc.), glass bottles & jars, plastic containers (#1 & #2), aluminum cans, steel cans, tin cans, empty aerosol cans.

## Leaf Collection Guidelines

Leaf collection in East Norriton Township begins the 3rd Monday of October each year and ends approximately the 2nd Friday of December. The following is the proposed schedule (weather permitting):

**Mondays . . . . . Coleston & Dekalb Manor**  
**Tuesdays & Wednesdays . . Arch Rd. to North Wales Rd.**  
**Thursdays & Fridays . . . North Wales Rd. to Trooper Rd.**

Thursdays will also be bag day (plastic trash bags to be used). The following roads will be bag collection only: DeKalb Pike, Swede Rd., Johnson Highway, Old Arch Rd., Germantown Pike, Township Line Rd., Whitehall Rd., Burnside Ave., Trooper Rd., Marion Ave., Hilltop Rd. Sardaro Ln., New Hope St. and all side streets of the Rahway Avenue Section.

It is requested that leaves be gathered in small piles, approximately eighteen (18) inches high by eighteen (18) inches wide in size to ensure efficient collection. All leaves must be placed in street along the curb line. Township employees are not permitted to enter private property to rake leaves. Any delay in the schedule because of inclement weather will postpone collection to the following day. Residents are asked not to park on the leaf piles as this hinders the leaf collection process. Also limbs, brush, grass clippings and other debris should not be mixed with the leaves.

## Emergency Medical Cards Available at Township Building

Special bright orange emergency medical cards can be picked up at the East Norriton Township Building or at the Plymouth Community Ambulance Association station. Once filled out, these bright orange cards and the 911 magnet should be placed on the refrigerator.

The information on these cards is critical for emergency medical personnel to have when responding to an emergency. This information will allow physicians in emergency rooms to have first-hand information on medications a patient is taking in emergency situations.

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR RESIDENTS

### *Selling Your Property?*

Prior to the sale of any property in East Norriton Township, the sewer lateral for the property must be televised and/or inspected by the Township. This additional inspection requirement has been implemented in accordance with the Township's Consent Order and Agreement with the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection.

In most cases, this inspection will be performed in conjunction with a Use and Occupancy permit inspection. It is recommended that anyone selling their property apply for a Use and Occupancy permit a minimum of 30 days before their intended settlement date to allow adequate time for the inspection to be performed and for repairs to be made, if necessary.

Any questions regarding the Use and Occupancy permit inspection process or the sewer lateral inspection process may be directed to the Code Enforcement Department at 610-275-2800 x148.

## EMS Tax Amendments

ACT 7 was signed by Governor Rendell that makes significant changes to the EMS Tax currently permitted under the Local Tax Enabling Act and levied by East Norriton Township. The Township is currently in the process of amending its ordinance to provide for these changes. The following is a synopsis of the changes to the tax that apply to all employees who work in East Norriton Township:

- Changes the name of the Tax from Emergency and Municipal Services to Local Services Tax.
- Requires East Norriton Township, whose rate is \$52.00 per year, to grant a \$12,000 or less income exemption.
- Changes the type of income to be used to determine liability for tax from ALL sources (including unearned income) to Earned Income only.
- Changes the withholding of any tax levied at a rate greater than \$10.00 from a one time deduction to a payroll based deduction. (i.e. if you are paid weekly, \$1 per week will be deducted for the \$52.00 tax)
- Limits the application of the tax to one jurisdiction per person per payroll period. If a taxpayer works in more than 1 taxing area, the tax will be due to the area of the taxpayer's residence if employed there or in the absence of this criteria, the taxing authority closest to their place of residence.
