

**RESOLUTION NO. 2126**

**EAST NORRITON TOWNSHIP  
MONTGOMERY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA**

**WHEREAS**, East Norriton Township relies on the liquid fuels money generated by the state gas tax to help maintain its 48 miles of township roads; and

**WHEREAS**, East Norriton Township receives about \$216,000.00 per year in liquid fuels disbursements but spends about \$500,000.00 per year to maintain and construct township roads, the balance of which is paid for by local taxes; and

**WHEREAS**, Municipalities are true partners with the Commonwealth in not only providing safe and efficient transportation for the state's motorists but also in constructing and maintaining needed infrastructure; and

**WHEREAS**, A steady and predictable method of funding local road maintenance and construction is paramount in providing the citizens of the Commonwealth with safe and adequate transportation; and

**WHEREAS**, The current local share of the gas tax is not sufficient to adequately maintain local roadways because the local share has decreased over the last 20 years;


**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Board of Supervisors of East Norriton Township, Montgomery County urges its state legislators to support an increase in the state gas tax only if local government receives its fair share of 25 percent of any increase.
