**RESOLUTION FOR ESTABLISHING AN HISTORIC RESOURCES
INVENTORY LIST FOR THE TOWNSHIP OF EAST NORRITON**

WHEREAS, the Second Class Township Code authorizes the Board of Supervisors to make and adopt ordinances that are consistent with the constitution and the laws of the Commonwealth that it deems necessary for the proper management, care and control of the Township and the maintenance of peace, good government, health and welfare of the Township and its citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of East Norriton Township, Montgomery County, Pennsylvania, has enacted and ordained by the authority of same Chapter Eleven (11), Section Seven (7) Subpart C(4) which provides, East Norriton Township Board of Supervisors shall, by Resolution, establish a list of historic resources entitled Historic Resource Inventory List.
