East Norriton Township to Hold a Spring Shredding Event

Due to the popularity of this annual event, East Norriton Township will again provide a PAPER SHREDDING EVENT in the spring of this year for our residents in addition to our fall program.

East Norriton Township residents are invited to bring their unwanted personal and confidential items to the East Norriton Township Building on Saturday May 14th to have them shredded. The shredding event will be held in the parking lot of the bocce courts at Stanbridge Street Park, 2501 Stanbridge Street, East Norriton, PA from 9 a.m. – 12 noon. The shredding event is being held to help lower the risk of identity theft. To keep the line moving, residents are asked to limit your time in line by only bringing two file boxes or three grocery bags of material to be shredded at a time. If you have additional material, you may get back in line to shred more items. Please make sure there are no plastic binders, black binder clips, DVD's or metal included in your material. Paper clips and staples are okay. Plan to bring your unwanted and confidential papers to the Township Building to dispose of them in a safe and secure manner.

Sewer Billing Update

First quarter sewer bills covering water consumption for December, January, and February will be mailed by April 1st. Second quarter sewer bills covering water consumption for March, April, and May will be mailed by July 1st.

Hundreds of customers have already signed up for **AUTO PAY**. **AUTO PAY** automatically debits your checking or savings account to pay your sewer bill when it's due! Tax Collection

For 2016, East Norriton Township's Real Estate Tax millage rate remained 2.727 mills, and Montgomery County's Real Estate Tax millage rate has increased to 3.459 mills. Taxes are based on the assessed value as determined by the Montgomery County Board of Assessment. The discount period for property taxes ends on May 1st and the face period ends on July 1st. Taxes can be paid by mail, at the Township building, online through the Township's website, or at the East Norriton Bryn Mawr Trust Bank located at 113 West Germantown Pike.


The Board of Supervisors of East Norriton Township adopted an annual budget for the 2016 calendar year in December 2015. A summary of the adopted budget is as follows:

East Norriton Residents Encouraged to Sign-up for Blackboard Connect

East Norriton residents are reminded that East Norriton Township has been utilizing Blackboard Connect for about two years to notify residents of emergencies, and upcoming public events. Each message sent by the Township reaches nearly 5,700 resident's phone numbers, 234 e-mails and 124 texts. The Township also utilizes this system to notify our businesses of important information. About 920 businesses can also receive these important messages. You can set up your own account through Blackboard Connect to manage how you want to receive your notifications (phone, e-mail or text) and to add or change phone numbers or add your e-mail account. A link to Blackboard Connect for East Norriton Township users is located on our home page of our web site, www.eastnorritontwp.org under the current Township Newsletter link. To date, we have about 300 residents who have set up their own account to add or change phone numbers and the ability to set preferences on how to receive the different type of messages. The site has been used for snow emergencies, road closures, special public safety announcements and notification about upcoming programs and special events sponsored by the Township.

SPRING LEAF COLLECTION DATES & REMINDERS

- WHAT:** Vacuum collection of leaves only.
NO BAGGED LEAVES!
- WHEN:** 2-week period between April 18th & April 29th.
- WHERE:** Curbside collection of raked leaves on all Township owned streets. Residents who live along the busier streets in the Township (Germantown Pk, Dekalb Pk, Township Line, Swede, Whitehall, Trooper, and Burnside) are asked **not to rake your leaves into the street** as this can create a safety hazard to motorists.
- HOW: SCHEDULED-SERVICE ONLY!** Call the Township offices at (610) 275-2800 ext.111 or submit the form on our website to schedule a pick-up. All requests must be received by Wednesday, April 27th.

Please understand that this service is for leaves only! Any piles containing branches, limbs, brush, grass clippings or other debris will not be collected. **This is separate from the Yard Waste Recycling Program. Please refer to the Yard Waste Recycling Program article in this newsletter for details about that program.**



YARD WASTE RECYCLING REMINDER

Below is a list of program reminders. Your efforts in adhering to these guidelines are greatly appreciated and will ensure timely collection of your materials.

- **Collections are the 3rd Thursday of each month.** Please check your calendar for the dates.
- **Scheduled service:** Call 610-275-2800 x111 or submit the form on our website **at least 2 days in advance** to schedule collection.
- **Includes:** shrubbery, branches, limbs & garden residue.
- **Not included:** stumps, weeds, grass or leaves.
- **Placement:** within 5 ft. of curb (not in the street). Please do not block sidewalks.
- **Limits:** bundles – max 2 ft. dia. and/or 40 lbs.; individual branches – max 5 in. dia.
- **Quantity limits:** 2 cubic yards per property (approx. ten 32-gallon cans or six bundles).
- **Bundles:** smaller branches must be bundled. Bundled branches should be at least 3 ft. long. Smaller branches and twigs must be placed in cans.
- **Large Branches:** Larger branches (8 - 10ft. long) do not have to be bundled. Larger branches feed easily into chipper. No need to cut up. Just place cut end towards the street.
- **No No's:** plastic bags, heavy rope or wire (string or twine only); bundling small branches/twigs (less than 2 ft. long) as all of these practices "jam" the chipper and will not be collected.

Due to high volume and/or inclement weather, yard waste pick-up may be delayed by a day or two. Please be patient. If your yard waste has not been picked up by the Monday after the scheduled pick up date, please call the Township Building at 610-275-2800.

EAST NORRITON TOWNSHIP VETERANS MEMORIAL COMMITTEE

The East Norriton Township Veterans Memorial Committee has once again scheduled two events during 2016. The Committee has scheduled a Memorial Day Wreath Laying Ceremony in observance of Memorial Day on Sunday May 29th at 1 p.m. at the East Norriton Township Veterans Memorial just off Germantown Pike between Old and New Stanbridge Streets and a tattered and worn flag cremation ceremony on Tuesday June 14th, 2015 at the Norris City Cemetery at 11 a.m. Old worn and tattered flags can be dropped off at the East Norriton Township Building, 2501 Stanbridge Street in the box located on the porch of the Township Building prior to June 13th for proper disposal of your flag.

The Veterans Memorial Committee is continuing to sell engraved bricks for the Veterans Memorial. Cost for the brick

is \$50 which allows three lines of lettering with 15 spaces on each line. Forms can be picked up at the Township Building or call the Parks

and Recreation Office. Nearly 500 bricks now line the walkway to the Memorial. Bricks can be purchased to honor a friend or relative who served in the Armed Forces or just to show your support of the Memorial.

SUMMER SAFETY TIPS

Warmer weather will soon be here. More folks and our kids will be engaged in outdoor activities. Help us keep you safe by protecting yourself first.



Parents/Adults

- School will soon be closed for the summer and children will be out to play. Use extra caution when driving in neighborhoods and near playgrounds.
- Summer temperatures are high. Children and pets are not to be left unattended in cars.
- Going on vacation? Stop by the police department and fill out a Vacation Notice. Officers will check the perimeter of your residence while you're away.
- While Driving Remember: NO TEXTING, Use your Turn Signals, and if you have the windshield wipers ON for inclement weather, your headlights MUST be ON.

Children (Bicycle Safety)

- Never ride out into a street without stopping first.
- Obey stop signs.
- Check behind before turning, swerving, or changing lanes.
- Never follow another rider without applying the rules.
- Before you get on your bike, put on a helmet!

CRIME PREVENTION TIPS

Telephone and Internet Scams: Help Protect Yourself and Your Identity!

- Do not assume a credible-looking Web site is credible. Anyone can create a Web site that looks legitimate.
- If it seems too good to be true, it probably is. Call an officer, or a trusted family member or friend and run it by them.
- Be cautious of unsolicited e-mails and phone calls -- many are fraudulent.
- Be wary of anyone who asks for personal information. Do not give out any information to a person, business or web site you have not verified with a reputable source.
- Your Social Security number is not necessary unless you are applying for credit. Do not give it out.
- Be suspicious of anyone who contacts you and claims to be from a company with whom you have an account like a bank, credit card or phone company. If they ask for information that the business already has, do not give it to them. Call the company independently.
- Do not respond to offers that demand you act immediately or won't take "no" for an answer.
- Do not open e-mail attachments from unfamiliar sources. They could contain malicious programs designed to steal your personal information.
- Keep your computer protected. Having anti-virus software is great, but you also need anti-spam and spyware protection to keep scams and computer intruders at bay. Utilize and update your firewall.

DISTRACTION BURGLARIES

- Distraction burglaries involve multiple actors who may be communicating by cell phone or walkie-talkie.
- One or two actors distract homeowners by pretending to do work on their home or even somewhere else in the area; some have even pretended to be with utility companies.
- While the homeowner is distracted by conversation, being showed around the property, another actor unseen by the resident will enter the home looking for valuables.
- Protect yourself from these types of crime, if someone is at your door ask yourself:
 - Are you expecting anyone? If not, that should raise your awareness and suspicion level!
 - Are they claiming to be from a "company"? With your door closed ask for their Name, show Company ID and associated paperwork – pass documents through the letterbox, move to front window to show proof?
 - If you have concerns call the Company; tell them you are calling. If they are there for official business they will stay. Use the phonebook, phone directory assistance, or internet to obtain the Company's number.
- Additional Measures:
 - Keep ALL doors locked, especially the back/side doors when answering the front door.
 - Remember they work in pairs and the intent is to gain access to your property. So, while you are 'distracted' by one at the front door the other may be trying to enter your property via the back.
 - Try not to keep large sums of money in the house.
 - Protect valuables and Personal Documents by placing in locked safe or by keeping them hidden and/or not easily accessible.
 - Car and House Keys should be in a safe place.
- When to call 9-11:
 - WHENEVER you are suspicious or feel that the person/caller may be dishonest.
 - If someone tries or forces entry or enters your home without permission.
 - If you notice valuables/money missing shortly after someone has visited.
 - Whenever you think a crime has been, or is about to be committed.

A MESSAGE FROM THE OFFICE OF THE FIRE MARSHAL

CHIMINEA AND OUTDOOR FIREPLACE SAFETY

Chimineas and outdoor fireplaces are very popular in backyards throughout East Norriton Township. Although their use is allowed under the Fire Code and do not require a permit from the Township, there are restrictions that residents must comply with. Adhering to the requirements and safety tips will assure a safe and enjoyable outdoor experience.

Fire Code/Ordinance Requirements:

For the purpose of the ordinance, an approved outdoor fire is classified as any fire taking place on a residential property within East Norriton Township for the sole purpose of providing warmth or recreation and is contained within an approved device.

- Approved devices include: commercially manufactured chimineas, outdoor fireplaces and fire pit, with a total fuel area not exceeding three (3) feet in diameter and two (2) feet in height.
- Only seasoned fire wood, natural gas or propane may be used as fuel for outdoor fires.
- Outdoor fires cannot be located within twenty (20) feet of any property line and within fifteen (15) feet of any combustible structure. Combustible structures include: dwellings, garages, sheds, decks and fences.
- Any outdoor fire not complying with the above is prohibited.

General Safety Practices:

- Do not use during a high wind condition.
- All wood burning devices must be equipped with either a chimney (flue) or spark screen.
- The fireplace should be located on a non-combustible surface such as a brick or concrete patio.
- Burning leaves, trash or yard debris is not permitted.
- The fire must be attended at all times, if the fire is to be left unattended, it must be extinguished.
- Never use a flammable liquid to start the fire.
- Keep your neighbors in mind while burning outdoors. Smoke and other products of combustion can have an impact on surrounding yards and be drawn into neighboring houses.
- Dispose of all ashes in a safe manner. After 24 hours has passed, all left over hot ashes must be thoroughly dampened, cooled and stored in a metal can that is used solely for ash storage. Ashes that are 2 or 3 days old may appear to be safe, but can still retain enough heat to cause an unwanted fire. Do not discard hot ashes in a compost pile, paper bag, cardboard box or anything that is combustible. Also, be careful in handling partially burned wood. The wood may still be smoldering and cause a serious burn.



Please keep in mind, that if the Fire Department is contacted and determines your situation to be a fire hazard, the Fire Department can require you to extinguish your fire. If additional questions arise, please contact our office.

SMOKE DETECTOR DISTRIBUTION

Limited quantities of smoke detectors are available for distribution to East Norriton Township residents. Any resident needing smoke detectors or help installing smoke detectors should contact the Fire Marshal's Office. The smoke detectors are available at no cost to the residents of East Norriton Township and will be available while supplies last.

CLOTHES DRYER SAFETY

Doing laundry is most likely part of your everyday routine. But did you know how important taking care of your clothes dryer is to the safety of your home? With a few simple safety tips you can help prevent a clothes dryer fire.

- Have your dryer installed and serviced by a professional.
- Do not use the dryer without a lint filter.
- Make sure you clean the lint filter before or after each load of laundry. Remove lint that has collected around the drum.
- Rigid or flexible metal venting material should be used to sustain proper air flow and drying time.
- Make sure the air exhaust vent pipe is not restricted and the outdoor vent flap will open when the dryer is operating. Once a year, or more often if you notice that it is taking longer than normal for your clothes to dry, clean lint out of vent pipe or have a dryer lint removal service do it for you.
- Keep dryers in good working order. Gas dryers should be inspected by a qualified professional to make sure the gas line and connections are intact and free of leaks.
- Make sure the right plug and outlet are used and that the machine is connected properly.
- Follow the manufacturer's operating instructions and don't overload your dryer.
- Turn the dryer off if you leave home or when you go to bed.

And Don't Forget...

- Dryers should be properly grounded.
- Check to outdoor vent flap to make sure it is not covered by snow.
- Keep the area around your dryer clear of things that can burn, like boxes, cleaning supplies and clothing, etc.
- Clothes that have come in contact with flammable substances, like gasoline, paint thinner, or similar solvents should be laid outside to dry, then can be washed and dried as usual.

FACT: According to the National Fire Protection Association, the leading cause of home clothes dryer fires is failure to clean them.

FEMA TO UPDATE FLOODPLAIN MAPS

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has provided updated floodplain maps to the Township. The revised maps more accurately reflect the actual 100-year floodplain

As a result of the updates, residents who own properties located within the boundaries of the newly revised flood plain may want to purchase flood insurance for their properties; and mortgage companies may require residents to purchase flood insurance when their property is located within the floodplain.

The updated floodplain maps are available for review on the Township's website and in the Township's Code Enforcement Department.

This is message to alert all residents that vehicles parked on private or public properties with expired registration and/or inspection are strictly prohibited. Such vehicles cannot be parked on the street or on private property including residential driveways. If the Township becomes aware of any covered vehicles showing no sign of movement, the owner of the property may be contacted in order to confirm that the vehicle has a valid registration and inspection.

Improper storage of unlicensed and inoperable vehicles can be a detriment to our community. These unsightly vehicles clutter the neighborhood, contribute to blight, provide harborage for rodents and act as an attractive nuisance for children. In addition, the location of these unused vehicles could quite possibly interfere with the operation of emergency service vehicles.

RADON

Radon is a naturally occurring radioactive gas that is colorless, odorless and tasteless. The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection estimates that radon is present in 40% of all Pennsylvania homes and it is prevalent in Montgomery County. The gas is produced by the decay of uranium that is present in rocks and soil and it can enter homes through the walls and floors of crawl spaces and basements where it can accumulate in living spaces. Newer homes, which have been constructed to be less drafty and more energy efficient, are even more susceptible to radon gas accumulation.

According to the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection, radon exposure is the second leading cause of lung cancer and the United States Environmental Protection Agency has established a radon level of 4 picocuries per liter as an action level that warrants radon mitigation. Radon reduction systems are commonly installed to reduce indoor levels of radon gas when testing shows that the gas is present

at or above the action level established by the United States Environmental Protection Agency.

Because radon is colorless, odorless and tasteless, testing is the only way to know if you and your family are at risk from radon. Free radon test kits are available to Pennsylvania residents through the American Lung Association. Free radon test kits can be ordered through the following website: www.lunginfo.org/freeradonkit. In addition, numerous radon mitigation contractors can provide testing and homeowners can purchase continuous radon testing monitors that are similar to plug-in carbon monoxide alarms to monitor radon levels.

SOLICITATION

East Norriton Township requires each transient merchant, peddler or solicitor engaged in the selling, soliciting or canvassing of goods to obtain a Solicitation Permit. The permit identifies the person who is authorized to perform door to door soliciting and includes a color copy of the person's driver's license or government issued photo identification. A solicitation permit also limits the hours of solicitation to between the hours of 10:00am to 6:00pm. A solicitation permit issued by the Township does not represent an endorsement of a product or service being offered.

Individuals or groups going door to door or soliciting for religious purposes are exempt from the requirement to obtain a solicitation permit.

If you choose to speak with a solicitor that has come to your door you may ask to see their solicitation permit. We encourage you to contact the East Norriton Township Police Department by way of their non-emergency number (610-272-0747) if a solicitor does not have a permit or if their conduct is in any way inappropriate.

DRIVEWAY PAVING & EXPANSION

Spring and summer is the time of year when many homeowners think about having their driveway replaced, resurfaced or widened. Although this can enhance the value of a home there are several important items to consider. Take the time to select a reputable paving company or contractor before a contract is signed. Speak to neighbors or relatives that have had recent driveway improvements made to help in your selection of a contractor. Always ask a contractor for references and take the time to contact those individuals and look at the work that they had performed.

Permits are required for all types of driveway work with the exception of seal coating. A permit application should include a sketch of the proposed work if a driveway is to be widened. Feel free to contact the code enforcement department at East Norriton Township at 610-275-2800-ext 148 with any questions. Paving permit applications are available on the Township's website.

Free residential collection events are held outdoors from 9am-3pm, rain or shine. Residents may attend any Household Hazardous Waste event held by Bucks, Chester, Delaware, Montgomery or Philadelphia Counties.

There are no permanent drop off locations.

Event workers will unload your materials so please **remain in your vehicle.**

Toxic and flammable household chemicals are collected for proper disposal. **Acceptable items** include gasoline, oil, kerosene, turpentine, paint thinner, oil paint, stains, varnish, pool chemicals, herbicides, pesticides, antifreeze, caustic cleaners and solvents, mercury, thermometers, flares, fire extinguishers, lead acid batteries, rechargeable batteries, fluorescent tube light bulbs, CFL bulbs, mini propane canisters, and electric oil filled heaters. Containers returned upon request.

The maximum amount accepted is 25 gallons or 220 pounds. No 25- or 50-gallon drums.

Do Not Bring electronics, appliances, asbestos, explosives, ammunition, medical waste, radioactive waste, smoke detectors, items containing Freon, tires or the following:

- **Latex or Water-Based Paint** is not hazardous and can be placed in the trash once it is dry. Air dry latex paint or add absorbent material like kitty litter until paint becomes a solid.
- **Alkaline Household Batteries** are not hazardous and should be thrown in the trash.
- **Prescription Medications** should be disposed of in the secure drop boxes located in many area police stations, a list of which can be found in the Recycling Guide at MontgomeryCountyRecycles.org.
- **Propane Tanks** should be taken to locations listed in the Recycling Guide at MontgomeryCountyRecycles.org. Mini propane canisters are accepted at collections.
