


East Norriton Township to Hold Electronic Collection and Shredding Event Saturday, October 14th

Annual Fall Shredding Event

East Norriton Township residents are invited to bring their unwanted personal and confidential items to the East Norriton Township Building on Saturday October 14th to have them shredded. The shredding event will be held in the parking lot of the bocce courts at Stanbridge Street Park, 2501 Stanbridge Street, East Norriton, PA from 9 a.m. – 12 noon. The shredding event is being held to help lower the risk of identity theft. To keep the line moving, residents are asked to limit your time in line by only bringing two file boxes or three grocery bags of material to be shredded at a time. If you have additional material, you may get back in line to shred more items. Please make sure there are no plastic binders, black binder clips, DVD's or metal included in your material. Paper clips and staples are okay. Plan to bring your unwanted and confidential papers to the Township Building to dispose of them in a safe and secure manner.

Electronic Collection Program

Due to the increasing need for these electronic collection programs, East Norriton Township will again sponsor an Electronic Collection Program this fall, also to be held on Saturday October 14th from 9 a.m. to 12 noon behind the Public Works garage at the Township Complex. The Township is providing this program in accordance with Pennsylvania's Covered Device Recycling Act 108 of 2010. **PLEASE BE AWARE THAT THERE IS NOW A \$20 PER TELEVISION OR COMPUTER MONITOR CHARGE THAT WILL BE COLLECTED AT THE DROP OFF SITE. THIS CHARGE IS FOR TELEVISIONS AND**



COMPUTER MONITORS ONLY. ALL OTHER ITEMS ARE STILL COLLECTED FOR FREE. Items accepted include almost anything with a battery or cord including televisions, computer monitors, computers, lap tops, printers, scanners, fax machines, keyboards, speakers, copiers, VCR's/DVD's , portable digital music players, digital converter boxes, cable/satellite receivers, cd players, telephones and telephone equipment, cell phones, video game consoles, digital cameras, PDA's/calculators, stereo and radio equipment, typewriters, microwaves, toasters, irons, blenders, mixers, coffeemakers, vacuums, and other small household appliances. Please do not bring large white items such as refrigerators, washers, dryers or household hazardous waste, alkaline batteries, explosives or ammunition, medical waste, radioactive waste, air conditioners, dehumidifiers, or smoke detectors to this event.

Yard Waste Reminders

- Collection begins on the 3rd Thursday of each month.
- This is a scheduled service. Call the Township at 610-275-2800 and push 0 for receptionist or log onto Township website www.eastnorritontwp.org to register. Registration deadline is noon on the Tuesday prior to collections.
- **Please be patient! Due to high volume, collections may take a few days to complete.**
- OK – shrubbery, branches, limbs & garden residue.
- NOT OK – stumps, root balls, weeds, grass, leaves and old fire-wood. No plastic bags, heavy rope or wire (string or twine only).
- Place within 5 ft. of curb (not in the street or on sidewalk).
- Limits – 2 cubic yards per property (pile 6' L x 3' H x 3' D or six bundles).
- Bundles (smaller branches) – max 2' diameter, 40 lbs. and at least 3 ft. long.
- Large Branches – Max 5" diameter. No need to bundle large branches (8-10 ft. long) as they feed easily into chipper. No need to cut up. Just place cut end towards the street.

Proper preparation is key to ensuring your materials get collected. We have developed a door hanger notice to alert residents of issues with yard waste collection.

This value added service provides an opportunity for residents to dispose of limited quantities of trimmings. It's not intended to make things easier on the local tree contractors. If you hire a tree contractor, he should handle all of the branches and not place them at the curb for the Township to pick up.

Starting in January of 2018, Yard Waste will be picked up the 3rd Monday of each month. Register on-line or call in by Friday at noon prior to the pick-up date. If a Holiday is on the yard waste date, the yard waste will be picked up the next business day.

2018 Christmas Tree Collections

WHEN: Wednesday, January 3rd and Monday, January 8th

WHERE: Curbside throughout the Township

CALL-IN SERVICE: NO! We will canvass the entire Township

Details:

- Trees must be placed curbside by 6:00 am on collection date
- **Please be patient! Due to the number of trees and weather, it may take several days to cover the entire township each week.**
- Last year over 700 trees were collected and chipped
- Remove all ornaments, lights, garland and wires. No plastic bags please.
- Collections depend on Mother Nature's cooperation.



Leaf Collection Guidelines

- **REMINDER:** No bagged leaf collection. All leaves will be collected with our vacuum trucks.
- Do not rake or blow your leaves into the street. This creates a traffic hazard.
- Begins Tuesday, October 10th and ends on Friday December 8th (weather and volume permitting).
- Place leaves in small piles, approximately 18" high by 18" wide.
- Do not park on leaf piles as this hinders collection and poses a potential fire hazard.
- Township employees are not permitted to enter private property to rake leaves.
- Limbs, brush, grass clippings and other debris should not be mixed with the leaves.

ZONING AND CODE ENFORCEMENT DEPARTMENT



According to the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection, radon exposure is the second leading cause of lung cancer, and the United States Environmental Protection Agency has established a radon level of 4 picocuries per liter as an action level that warrants radon mitigation. Radon reduction systems are commonly installed to reduce indoor levels of radon gas when testing shows that the gas is present at or above the action level established by the United States Environmental Protection Agency.

Because radon is colorless, odorless and tasteless, testing is the only way to know if you and your family are at risk from radon. Numerous radon mitigation contractors can provide testing and homeowners can purchase continuous radon testing monitors that are similar to plug-in carbon monoxide alarms to monitor radon levels.

Solicitation

East Norriton Township requires each transient merchant, peddler or solicitor engaged in the selling, soliciting or canvassing of goods to obtain a Solicitation Permit. The permit identifies the person who is authorized to perform door to door soliciting and includes a color copy of the person's driver's license or government issued photo identification. A solicitation permit also limits the hours of solicitation to between the hours of 10:00am to 6:00pm. A solicitation permit issued by the Township does not represent an endorsement of a product or service being offered.

Individuals or groups going door to door or soliciting for religious purposes are exempt from the requirement to obtain a solicitation permit.

If you choose to speak with a solicitor that has come to your door you may ask to see their solicitation permit. We encourage you to contact the East Norriton Township Police Department by way of their non-emergency number at (610) 272-0747 if a solicitor does not have a permit or if their conduct is in any way inappropriate.

Driveway Paving and Expansion

If you are planning to have your driveway replaced, resurfaced or widened, which can enhance the value of your home, there are several important items to consider. Take the time to select a reputable paving company or contractor before a contract is signed. Speak to neighbors or relatives that have had recent driveway improvements made to help in your selection of a contractor. Always ask a contractor for references and take the time to contact those individuals and look at the work that they have performed.

Portable / Outdoor Fireplaces

Portable / outdoor fireplaces do not require a permit from the Township. As a general guide, portable / outdoor fireplaces should be located a minimum of 15' away from any structure. While being used, a portable / outdoor fireplace must be constantly attended until the fire is extinguished and a fire extinguisher or garden hose must be immediately available to extinguish the fire. Portable / outdoor fireplaces must also be used in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions. The Fire Code Official may order the extinguishment of a fire in a portable / outdoor fireplace if it creates or adds to a hazardous or objectionable situation.

Unlicensed and Inoperable Vehicles

This is a message to alert all residents that vehicles parked on private or public property with expired registration and/or inspection are strictly prohibited. Such vehicles cannot be parked on the street or on private property including residential driveways. If the Township becomes aware of any covered vehicles showing no sign of movement, the owner of the property may be contacted in order to confirm that the vehicle has a valid registration and inspection.

Improper storage of unlicensed and inoperable vehicles can be a detriment to our community. These unsightly vehicles clutter the neighborhood, contribute to blight, provide harborage for rodents and act as an attractive nuisance for children. In addition, the location of these unused vehicles could quite possibly interfere with the operation of emergency service vehicles.

Radon

Radon is a naturally occurring radioactive gas that is colorless, odorless and tasteless. The Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection estimates that radon is present in 40% of all Pennsylvania homes and it is prevalent in Montgomery County. The gas is produced by the decay of uranium that is present in rocks and soil and it can enter homes through the walls and floors of crawl spaces and basements where it can accumulate in living spaces. Newer homes, which have been constructed to be less drafty and more energy efficient, are even more susceptible to radon gas accumulation.

Did You Know?

You can pay your sewer bill online!

Just go to www.eastnorritontwp.org and look for the **Pay Online** option. It's easy, it's convenient and it's a great way to make that last minute payment!

Your property tax bill is calculated by multiplying your property's assessed value times a millage rate.

The Township's millage rate is 2.727, Montgomery County's millage rate is 3.849* and the Norristown Area School District's millage rate is 35.879. If your home has an assessed value of \$150,000, then you pay **\$409.05** in property taxes to the Township, **\$577.35** in property taxes to the County and **\$5,381.81** in taxes to the School District!

Permits are required for all types of driveway work with the exception of seal coating. A permit application should include a sketch of the proposed work if a driveway is to be widened. Feel free to contact the Code Enforcement department at East Norriton Township at (610) 275-2800 Ext: 155 with any questions. Paving permit applications are available on the Township's website.

Alternate Water Meter for Outside Water Consumption

Sewer billing rates are charged based water consumption regardless of whether or not the water was used for outdoor purposes. Residents may install a second water meter at their property for outdoor purposes such as watering gardens, washing cars, filling pools and supplying irrigation systems. In advance of the sewer bill being received, residents with alternate water meters will receive a post card to report and document their alternate meter usage which will be credited against their upcoming sewer bill.

Residents who are interested in installing a second water meter should obtain a plumbing permit from the Township. Plumbing permit applications are available on-line at the Township's website or at the municipal building.

Important Reminders

East Norriton Township Property Taxes must be paid by December 31, 2017. After that date, all delinquent taxes are turned over to Montgomery County Tax Claim Bureau. They then file liens against all delinquent properties. Fortunately, most of our residents pay their tax bill well before then which benefits us all! **Thank you!**

Norristown Area School District Property Taxes are collected by Michael Murray. East Norriton Township **does not** collect Norristown Area School District Taxes. Payments can be made locally at Bryn Mawr Trust located on Germantown Pike in East Norriton or sent to Michael B. Murray, 1632 West Marshall Street, Jeffersonville, PA 19403.

Township sewer bills are mailed to all properties connected to the sewer system four times a year – January 1st, April 1st, July 1st and October 1st. Bills are due within thirty (30) days following the bill date. Your timely payment prevents additional penalties being added to your account AND helps keep our sewer rates low! Your sewer bill is based on your water usage which is provided to us by PA-American Water Company. Please call PA-American for all questions concerning your usage.

spend countless hours training weekly. All of our volunteers have families, full time jobs, and many other day to day activities and responsibilities as well. The dedication from our fire fighters and members is priceless as they leave their families every time an emergency call comes in. During parties, holidays and bad weather — these dedicated members remain on call and ready to run out the door when they hear that alarm. Volunteers are always in need as there are many different responsibilities required to keep your local fire company operating and ready to act at any given time. At the conclusion of General Daddona's speech, a three shot volley and taps was provided by the Vietnam Veterans of




Norristown High School JROTC provided the Color Guard for the Annual Wreath Laying Ceremony.

Fall and Winter Fire Safety

Temperatures are falling fast. Another harsh winter is predicted across the country. Keep these tips in mind to stay warm and safe this fall and winter season.

Service Your Furnace

Before the cold weather sets in, have your furnace professionally serviced. They should ensure everything is in working order and that it is properly vented to the outside with no leaks.

Install Early Detection Systems for Smoke and Carbon Monoxide

November, December, January and February are the top months for carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning deaths in the United States. Nearly two-thirds of non-fire related CO deaths take place during these four cold weather months.

Carbon monoxide (CO) is a colorless, odorless, poisonous gas. You can't taste, see or smell CO, but it can kill in just minutes. Appliances fueled with natural gas, liquefied petroleum (LP gas), oil, kerosene, coal, or wood may produce CO. Burning charcoal also produces CO.

Early detection can save your life and the lives of your family. It is imperative that your house have smoke alarms and CO alarms, which should be installed on every level of your home and outside the sleeping areas. Change the batteries in your smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors when you turn back your clocks for Daylight Saving Time. Make sure to check the alarms with the new batteries installed. Most smoke and CO alarms have expiration dates and will beep when they need to be replaced. If you are not sure, check the date and replace if the unit is over 5 years old. Check and replace any home fire extinguishers that have expired.

Use Fireplaces Safely

Before the first use of the season, have your fireplace and chimney inspected and cleaned by a professional. Always use a fireplace screen to keep sparks from flying out of the fireplace. Never leave a burning fire unattended, and make sure a fire in a fireplace is completely out before going to bed. Always dispose of fire place ashes in a metal container with a lid; and be sure to store it a safe distance from your house or any other structures.

Use Caution with Space Heaters

Always read the instructions on the unit before you use it. If the

heater requires venting, make sure it is vented to the outdoors. Never use your stove or oven to heat your home; only use space heaters that are approved for this purpose. Always allow at least three feet of empty area around space heaters.

Use Extreme Caution with Portable Generators

When the power goes out in a snow or ice storm, it is nice to have back-up power through a portable generator. However, these units should be used with extreme caution. Always read the instructions on the unit before you use it. Never use inside a house, garage, basement, crawlspace, shed, or semi-enclosed area like a porch. When in use, generators should be at least 20 feet away from the house.

Reconsider Leaf Burning

Burning leaves produces dangerous and cancer-causing chemicals. Homeowners are urged to avoid burning leaves. Open burning is not permitted in East Norriton Township.

Please keep in mind, that if the Fire Department is contacted and determines your situation to be a fire hazard, the Fire Department can require you to extinguish your fire and or move to a safe location.

Exercise Candle Caution

Nearly 10,000 home fires start with improper candle use every year. Never leave candles burning unattended, and keep your candles away from pets and kids.

Use Fire Pits Safely

Outdoor fire pits have become very popular. To enjoy them safely, make sure the pit is made of an iron or stone basin. Always build or position the pit in a flat, open area away from trees. Be sure to use a screen that properly fits for added protection. Take care to place the pit on concrete, dirt or gravel and take special care to avoid areas with grass and leaves. Dispose of all ashes in a safe manner. After 24 hours has passed, all left over hot ashes must be thoroughly dampened, cooled and stored in a metal can that is used solely for ash storage. Ashes that are 2 or 3 days old may appear to be safe, but can still retain enough heat to cause an unwanted fire. Do not discard hot ashes in a compost pile, paper bag, cardboard box or anything that is combustible. Also, be careful in handling partially burned wood. The wood may still be smoldering and cause a serious burn.

Inclement Weather Tips

This is the time of year for wet leaf covered roadways. Snow and Ice are a possibility also. Keep your vehicles in good condition. Remember to leave plenty of space between your vehicle and the car ahead. Turn on your lights and windshield wipers during periods of inclement weather for greater visibility. ***Did you know that the law requires you to have your headlights on any time you have your windshield wipers on for inclement weather?***

- **Roadways** – Roads become slippery when covered with snow, sleet and freezing rain. Allow extra distance (at least six to eight seconds following distances) between your car and the car ahead. Check your tires and winterize your car now. Be prepared.
- **Township Ordinance for snow removal and parking** – Please remember to remove your car from Township roadways when it's snowing or when snow is in the forecast. The ordinance requires cars to be off the roadway during ANY snow. This allows the Township road crews to clear the roads of snow. Any vehicle parked after crews are out will be ticketed and possibly towed. **ALSO** please be aware that the Ordinance does include: Sidewalks or Township right-of-ways which means if any owner, agent, occupant of property, or person in charge of the property allows snow to be pushed, plowed, thrown or shoveled onto a right-of-way or sidewalk they will be subject to a fine.
- **Holiday Safety** – Take the time to safeguard your valuables during the busy Holiday season. Guard your personal information and credit cards. Place Holiday purchases and packages in the trunk of your vehicle and out of sight of would be thieves. Finally, please remember to lock your doors.





INFORMATION ON WINTER STORMS PARKING REGULATIONS DURING SNOW EVENTS

Snow plowing on all township roads begins after 2 inches of snow has fallen. If an accumulation of snow is in the forecast, be on the safe side, and remove your cars from the street. Anytime snow plows are dispatched during a snow storm, parking is prohibited on all township roads except in areas where no off street parking is available. In those areas where there is no off street parking available, all motor vehicles shall be parked on the even side of the street on even numbered calendar days, and on the odd side of the street on odd numbered calendar days. Please note parking in cul-de-sacs during snow storms is also prohibited. Any vehicles parked on the street during a snow storm may be towed and fined.



The Township's snow removal procedure calls for snow emergency routes to be salted and cindered first. This is to ensure that all developments in the township can be accessed by emergency vehicles (fire, police, and ambulance). During heavier snow storms, snow emergency roads will be completely cleared the entire cartway prior to equipment starting to plow on secondary roads.

Should you have a non-medical emergency during a snow storm,

please contact the East Norriton Township Police Department at 610-272-0748. For medical emergencies, please dial 911.

Property owners are reminded that sidewalks are required to have at least a 30 inch path cleared within 24 hours after a snow. Residents are also reminded not to throw snow from your sidewalks and driveway onto the roads. Also, please be aware that the Snow Ordinance has been amended to include: Sidewalks or Township right-of-ways which means if any owner, agent, occupant of property, or person in charge of the property allows snow to be pushed, plowed, thrown or shoveled onto a right-of-way or sidewalk they will be subject to a fine. *Throwing snow onto a roadway or township right-of-way is a violation of township ordinance and punishable with up to a \$600.00 fine.* Your cooperation is vital to keep snow and debris off the roadway and allow emergency vehicles to get to the emergency locations. Please check your mail boxes to make sure it is sound and at least 6" behind the face of the curb. Mailboxes which hang out past the curb might be damaged during snow plowing operations. East Norriton Township and the Norriton Fire Department also request that all fire hydrants that are located in front of your home also be cleared of snow.

Did You Know?

In 1689 ... William Penn ordered Captain Thomas Holme, a surveyor general, to layout a tract of land east of the Schuylkill River. The tract of land containing 7482 acres (at present day East and West Norriton and Norristown), was called, the Manor of Williamstadt.

In 1704 ... The founder of Pennsylvania, William Penn gave the property known as the Manor of Williamstadt to his son, William Penn, Jr. Five days later, William Penn Jr. sold the property to Isaac Norris and William Trent.

In 1712 ... Isaac Norris purchased Trent's share for 850 pounds.

In 1730 ... The Township of Norriton was created, which was made up of 20 landowners.

In 1812 ... The Township of Norriton was separated from Norristown when Norristown became incorporated.

In 1909 ... By court order, The Township of Norriton was separated and two townships were formed, they are, East Norriton and West Norriton.

Mailbox Policy During Snow Plowing

(Approved by the Board of Supervisors on October 23, 2007)

- Any installation within the township's road's right of way, including mailboxes or parked cars during a declared snow emergency, is placed there at the owner's risk.
- Therefore, owners are encouraged to install mailboxes at the minimum usable distance from the edge of the roadway. Posts should be checked for deterioration to reduce the possibility that the weight of the plowed snow may simply break or push the post over.
- East Norriton Township shall not repair or replace mailboxes or posts damaged by the force or placement of snow.

East Norriton Township Holiday Parade Road Closures

The East Norriton Township Holiday Parade will be held on Saturday December 2nd, 2017. The rain date will be Sunday, December 3rd, 2017.

The Holiday Parade will start at the East Norriton Middle School on Roland Drive and will proceed south on Stony Creek Road to West Germantown Pike. The parade will then turn east on Germantown Pike and end at the Hillcrest Plaza Shopping Center.

Parade participants are asked to enter Roland Drive from Township Line Road for Parade Line up and drop off of participants.

The following roads within East Norriton Township will be closed to all vehicular traffic from 10:45 a.m. – 12 noon.

- 1.) Stony Creek Road from Roland Drive to West Germantown Pike
- 2.) West Germantown Pike both east and west bound traffic from North Wales Road to Swede Road. All side streets on that portion of West Germantown Pike will be shut off to traffic. No vehicles will be permitted to travel on that portion of the roadway during these specified times.
