## Sewer Billing Update

First quarter sewer bills covering water consumption for December, January, and February will be mailed by April 1st. Second quarter sewer bills covering water consumption for March, April, and May will be mailed by July 1st.

## Sewer AUTO PAY Program!

How would you like to stop writing checks to pay your sewer bills, save postage and avoid late fees? You can do all that through our AUTO PAY program! Hundreds of customers have already signed up for AUTO PAY. AUTO PAY automatically debits your checking or savings account to pay your sewer bill when it's due! There is no cost to use this service and it's safe and secure! You can download the authorization form from the Township's website or call 610-275-2800 for more information!

## Tax Collection

East Norriton Township's Real Estate Tax rate remains the same as it has for several years at 2.727 mills. Montgomery County's Real Estate Tax millage rate is still 3.459 mills, however a new County tax for the Montgomery County Community College of .39 mills will appear on your bill. Taxes are based on the assessed value of your property as determined by the Montgomery County Board of Assessment. The discount period for property taxes ends on May 1st and the face period ends on July 1st. Taxes can be paid by mail, at the Township building, online through the Township's website, or at the East Norriton Bryn Mawr Trust Bank located at 113 West Germantown Pike.



## SUMMER SAFETY TIPS

The weather will soon be changing and our kids will be getting outside to play more. Help us keep you safe by protecting yourself first.



### Parents/Adults

- School will soon be closed for the summer, and children will be at play. Use extra caution when driving in neighborhoods and near play grounds.
- Summer temperatures are high. Don't leave children and pets in cars unattended.
- Going on vacation? Consider letting the police know and file a vacation notice (available online at [eastnorritontwp.org](http://eastnorritontwp.org)). Officers will check your residence while you're away.

### Children (Bicycle Safety)

- Never ride out into a street without stopping first.
- Obey stop signs.
- Check behind before turning, swerving, or changing lanes.
- Never follow another rider without applying the rules.
- Before you get on your bike, put on a helmet!

## CRIME PREVENTION TIPS

We have seen several scams occurring throughout Montgomery County. The most common have been internet and phone scams. It is currently difficult if not impossible to investigate and prosecute both internet and telephone crimes because they are so intertwined in today's technology. Help protect yourself and don't be a victim by following these simple steps:

- Do not assume a credible-looking Web site is credible. Anyone can create a Web site that looks legitimate.
- If it seems too good to be true, it probably is. Call an officer, or a trusted family member or friend and run it by them.
- Be cautious of unsolicited e-mails and phone calls -- many are fraudulent.
- Be wary of anyone who asks for personal information. Do not give out any information to a person, business or web site you have not verified with a reputable source.
- Your Social Security number is not necessary unless you are applying for credit. Do not give it out.
- Be suspicious of anyone who contacts you and claims to be from a company with whom you have an account like a bank, credit card or phone company. If they ask for information that the business already has, do not give it to them. Call the company independently.
- **Do not respond to offers that demand you act immediately or won't take "no" for an answer.**
- Do not open e-mail attachments from unfamiliar sources. They could contain malicious programs designed to steal your personal information.
- Watch out for pop-up windows asking you to enter in financial data. Legitimate companies won't require you to submit sensitive information this way.
- Keep your computer protected. Having anti-virus software is great, but you also need anti-spam and spyware protection to keep scams and computer intruders at bay. Utilize and update your firewall.

## DISTRACTION BURGLARIES

We have seen several distraction burglaries. For residents who have not heard of them, distraction burglaries involve multiple actors who may be communicating by cell phone or walkie-talkie. One or two actors may distract homeowners by pretending to do work on their home or even somewhere else in the area; some have even pretended to be with utility companies. While the homeowner is distracted by conversation, being showed around the property, another actor who is often unseen by the resident will enter the home looking for valuables. Protect yourself from these types of crime beginning when you hear a knock at the door by thinking:

### 1. Are you expecting anyone?

- If someone is claiming to be from a company remember to ask what it is they are there for.
- Always ask for an ID or any associated paperwork – get them to pass these through the letterbox as at this point you should still have your door closed.
- If you have any doubt you should ring the company they say they are from independently. Never ring the number given by the caller but instead locate it from another source e.g. phonebook or directory enquiries.

### 2. Additional Measures:

- Ensure that your back door is always closed when answering the door. Caller's intent on gaining access to your property may be working in pairs – whilst one distracts you at your front door the other may be trying to enter your property via the back.
- Never keep large sums of money in the house – use a bank or building society if possible.
- Keep valuables and items of sentimental value where they are not easily accessible – the use of a small safe might be appropriate.

- Keep documents containing personal details out of sight e.g. passport, utility bills, bank statements etc.
- Make sure you keep your keys in a safe place and not on display.

### 3. When to call the police:

- If you are suspicious or feel that the caller may be phony.
- If someone forces entry or enters your home without permission.
- You notice valuables or money have gone missing shortly after someone has visited.
- Whenever you think a crime has been, or is about to be committed.

## SPRING LEAF COLLECTION DATES & REMINDERS

**WHAT:** Vacuum collection of leaves only.  
**NO BAGGED LEAVES!**

**WHEN:** 2-week period April 17th thru April 28th

**WHERE:** Curbside collection of raked leaves on all Township owned streets. Residents who live along the busier streets in the Township (Germantown Pk, Dekalb Pk, Township Line, Swede, Whitehall, Trooper, and Burnside) are asked **not to rake your leaves into the street** as this can create a safety hazard to motorists.

**HOW: SCHEDULED-SERVICE ONLY!** Call the Township offices at (610) 275-2800 ext.111 or submit the form on our website to schedule a pick-up. All requests must be received by Wednesday, April 26th.

Please understand that this service is for leaves only! Any piles containing branches, limbs, brush, grass clippings or other debris will not be collected. **This is separate from the Yard Waste Recycling Program. Please refer to the Yard Waste Recycling Program article in this newsletter for details about that program.**



## YARD WASTE RECYCLING REMINDER

Below is a list of program reminders. Your efforts in adhering to these guidelines are greatly appreciated and will ensure timely collection of your materials.

- **Collections are the 3rd Thursday of each month.** Please check your calendar for the dates.
- **Scheduled service:** Call 610-275-2800 x111 or submit the form on our website **at least 2 days in advance** to schedule collection.
- **Includes:** shrubbery, branches, limbs & garden residue.
- **Not included:** stumps, weeds, grass or leaves.
- **Placement:** within 5 ft. of curb (not in the street). Please do not block sidewalks.
- **Limits:** bundles – max 2 ft. dia. and/or 40 lbs.; individual branches – max 5 in. dia.
- **Quantity limits:** 2 cubic yards per property (approx. ten 32-gallon cans or six bundles).
- **Bundles:** smaller branches must be bundled. Bundled branches should be at least 3 ft. long. Smaller branches and twigs must be placed in cans.
- **Large Branches:** Larger branches (8 - 10ft. long) do not have to be bundled. Larger branches feed easily into chipper. No need to cut up. Just place cut end towards the street.
- **No No's:** plastic bags, heavy rope or wire (string or twine only); bundling small branches/twigs (less than 2 ft. long) as all of these practices "jam" the chipper and will not be collected.

*Due to high volume and/or inclement weather, yard waste pick-up may be delayed by a day or two. Please be patient. If your yard waste has not been picked up by the Monday after the scheduled pick up date, please call the Township Building at 610-275-2800.*

## EAST NORRITON TOWNSHIP VETERANS MEMORIAL COMMITTEE

The East Norriton Township Veterans Memorial Committee has once again scheduled two events during 2017. The Committee has scheduled a Memorial Day Wreath Laying Ceremony in observance of Memorial Day on Sunday May 28th at 1 p.m. at the East Norriton Township Veterans Memorial just off Germantown Pike between Old and New Stanbridge Streets. Guest speaker for this year's program is General Richard Daddona (retired).

A tattered and worn flag cremation ceremony is scheduled for Wednesday June 14th, 2017 at the Norris City Cemetery at 11 a.m. Old worn and tattered flags can be dropped off at the East Norriton Township

Building, 2501 Stanbridge Street in the box located on the porch of the Township Building prior to June 13th for proper disposal of your flag.

The Veterans Memorial Committee is continuing to sell engraved bricks for the Veterans Memorial. Cost for the brick is \$50 which allows three lines of lettering with 15 spaces on each line. Forms can be picked up at the Township Building or call the Parks and Recreation Office. Nearly 500 bricks now line the walkway to the Memorial. Bricks can be purchased to honor a friend or relative who served in the Armed Forces or just to show your support of the Memorial.



# ZONING AND CODE ENFORCEMENT DEPARTMENT

Effective January 3, 2017, East Norriton Township requires a Dumpster Permit for all stand-alone dumpster(s) including bagsters/ bag dumpster(s) and POD(s) that are not currently associated with an existing permit. Please stop into the Township Building or visit our website to obtain the permit.

## WORKING DOUBLE TIME

Our Code Enforcement Officials are also Fire Fighters for East Norriton Township. They are on the lookout not only for code violations but are responsible for maintaining your health, safety, and welfare. Make sure to say Hi to Joe Perkins and Joe Catagnus when you see them out and about!

## YOUR TOWN..YOUR VILLAGE..THE NEXT STEP

East Norriton Township is a town with hustle and bustle along its two main roadways of Germantown Pike and Route 202 and is surrounded by other residential communities. Resident's inquire often how future development and redevelopment will

affect East Norriton Township. The Pennsylvania Municipalities Planning Code requires that the comprehensive plan be revised every 10 years. East Norriton Township is upon its 10 year revision and is inviting the public to get involved. The residents and business community of East Norriton Township are its strongest asset to planning and implementing a well sought for community for years to come.

A Comprehensive Plan Committee was appointed by the Board of Supervisors at the February 2017 meeting. The steering committee will focus on comprehensive plan revisions, zoning code revisions, and subdivision and land development code revisions to ensure the viability and prosperity of local businesses, maintain open space, and create sustainable reasonable residential and commercial development and re-development. Please check the Township's website regularly for workshop meetings that are open to the public to contribute to this process.

## EAST NORRITON TOWNSHIP TO HOLD ELECTRONIC COLLECTION AND SHREDDING EVENT: SATURDAY, APRIL 29TH

### ANNUAL SPRING SHREDDING EVENT

East Norriton Township residents are invited to bring their unwanted personal and confidential items to the East Norriton Township Building on Saturday April 29th to have them shredded. The shredding event will be held in the parking lot of the bocce courts at Stanbridge Street Park, 2501 Stanbridge Street, East Norriton, PA from 9 a.m. – 12 noon. The shredding event is being held to help lower the risk of identity theft. To keep the line moving, residents are asked to limit your time in line by only bringing two file boxes or three grocery bags of material to be shredded at a time. If you have additional material, you may get back in line to shred more items. Please make sure there are no plastic binders, black binder clips, DVD's or metal included in your material. Paper clips and staples are okay. Plan to bring your unwanted and confidential papers to the Township Building to dispose of them in a safe and secure manner.

### ELECTRONIC COLLECTION PROGRAM

ALL OTHER ITEMS ARE STILL COLLECTED FOR FREE.** Items accepted include almost anything with a battery or cord including televisions, computer monitors, computers, lap tops, printers, scanners, fax machines, keyboards, speakers, copiers, VCR's/DVD's, portable digital music players, digital converter boxes, cable/satellite receivers, cd players, telephones and telephone equipment, cell phones, video game consoles, digital cameras, PDA's/calculators, stereo and radio equipment, typewriters, microwaves, toasters, irons, blenders, mixers, coffeemakers, vacuums, and other small household appliances. Please do not bring large white items such as refrigerators, washers, dryers or household hazardous waste, alkaline batteries, explosives or ammunition, medical waste, radioactive waste, air conditioners, de/humidifiers, or smoke detectors to this event. # A MESSAGE FROM THE OFFICE OF THE FIRE MARSHAL

## GRILLING SAFETY

There's nothing like outdoor grilling. It's one of the most popular ways to cook food. But, a grill placed too close to anything that can burn is a fire hazard. They can be very hot, causing burn injuries. Follow these simple tips and you will be on the way to safe grilling. **FACTS:** July is the peak month for grill fires and Roughly half of the injuries involving grills are thermal burns.

### SAFETY TIPS:

- Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors.
- The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area.
- Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat build-up from the grills and in trays below the grill.
- Never leave your grill unattended.
- Always make sure your gas grill lid is open before lighting it.

East Norriton Township Ordinance prevents open-flame cooking devices from being operated on combustible balconies, decks and within 10 feet of combustible construction.

### CHARCOAL GRILLS:

- There are several ways to get the charcoal ready to use. Charcoal chimney starters allow you to start the charcoal using newspaper as a fuel.
- If you use starter fluid, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the fire.
- Keep charcoal fluid out of the reach of children and away from heat sources.
- When you are finished grilling, let the coals completely cool before disposing in a metal container. Dispose of all ashes in a safe manner. After 24 hours has passed, all left over hot ashes must be thoroughly dampened and cooled. Ashes that are 2 or 3 days old may appear to be safe, but can still retain enough heat to cause an unwanted fire. Do not discard hot ashes in a compost pile, paper bag, cardboard box or anything that is combustible.

### PROPANE GRILLS:

Check the gas tank hose for leaks before using it for the first time each year. Apply a light soap and water solution to the hose. A propane leak will release bubbles. If your grill has a gas leak, by smell or the soapy bubble test, and there is no flame, turn off both the gas tank and the grill. If the leak stops, get the grill serviced before using it again. If the leak does not stop, call the fire department. **If you smell gas while cooking, immediately get away from the grill and call the fire department.** Do not move the grill. If the flame goes out, turn the grill and gas off and wait at least 5 minutes before re-lighting it.

Please keep in mind, that if the Fire Department is contacted and determines your situation to be a fire hazard, the Fire Department can require you to extinguish your fire and or move to a safe location. If additional questions arise, please contact our office.

## DO YOU HAVE A PERSON IN YOUR LIFE WHO MAY BE A HOARDER?

Hoarding is a condition where a person has persistent difficulty discarding personal possessions. The large amount of possessions fills the home and prevents the normal use of the space. Living space becomes cluttered. It may be unusable. Hoarding brings distress and emotional health concerns.

### WHY HOARDING INCREASES FIRE RISK:

- Cooking is unsafe if flammable items are close to the stove or oven. And heating units may be too close to things that can burn. They might also be placed on unstable surfaces. If a heater tips over into a pile, it can cause a fire.
- Electrical wiring may be old or worn from the weight of piles. Pests could chew on wires. Damaged wires can start fires
- Open flames from smoking materials or candles in a home with excess clutter are very dangerous.
- Blocked pathways and exits may hinder escape from a fire.

### HOW HOARDING IMPACTS FIRST RESPONDERS:

- Hoarding puts first responders in harm's way.
- Firefighters cannot move swiftly through a home filled with clutter.
- Responders can be trapped in a home when exits are blocked. They can be injured by objects falling from piles
- The weight of the stored items, especially if water is added to put out a fire, can lead to building collapse.
- Fighting fires is very risky in a hoarding home. It is hard to enter the home to provide medical care. The clutter impedes to search and rescue of people and pets.

### HOW CAN YOU HELP REDUCE THE RISK OF FIRE INJURY?

- When talking to a person who hoards, focus on safety rather than the clutter. Be empathetic. Match the person's language. If they call it hoarding, then you can call it hoarding.
- Help the residents make a home safety and escape plan. Stress the importance of clear pathways and exits. Practice the plan often. Exit routes may change as new items are brought into the home.
- Install working smoke alarms in the home. Test them at least once a month.
- Reach out to community resources. Talk to members of the fire department to alert them of your concerns. They may be able to connect you with resources within Montgomery County for additional help.




