

ORDINANCE NO. 18

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING HUNTING OF ANY GAME WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF EAST NORRITON, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, AND THE DISCHARGE OF FIREARMS, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS.

The Supervisors of East Norriton Township, Montgomery County, Pennsylvania, do hereby enact and ordain as follows:

WHEREAS, it is necessary to take means for securing the safety of persons or property within the Township, the following provisions are considered necessary:

SECTION 1. From and after the enactment of this ordinance, it shall be unlawful for any person to hunt for, shoot at, kill, or attempt to shoot at or kill any game within the Township of East Norriton, or to discharge firearms in the Township except as hereinafter provided.

SECTION 2. This ordinance shall not prohibit legal hunting by residents without a license as provided for by the Act of June 3, 1937, P.L. 1225, Article 3, Section 317, as amended (34 P.S. Sec. 1311.317).

SECTION 3. The discharge of firearms shall be permitted for target practice or other lawful purpose, provided written permission is granted by the Chief of Police of East Norriton Township, to discharge firearms at such times and under such conditions as said Police Chief may impose to insure the safety of the Township citizens.

SECTION 4. Any person or persons violating this Ordinance shall upon being adjudged guilty in any proceeding brought by virtue hereof before any Justice of the Peace having jurisdiction within said Township, be sentenced to pay a fine, for the use of said Township, of not less than Five Dollars (\$5.00) nor more

than Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00), for each offense, and in default of paying said fine and all costs accrued, shall be committed to the County Jail for a period not exceeding five (5) days.
