

ORDINANCE NO. 37

OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE
TOWNSHIP OF EAST NORRITON, MONTGOMERY
COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE USE OF CERTAIN TOWNSHIP ROADS WHEN DESIGNATED BY TOWNSHIP RESOLUTION BY COMMERCIAL VEHICLES AS DEFINED IN SAID ORDINANCE, BUT PERMITTING COMMERCIAL VEHICLES TO RENDER SERVICES IN A RESTRICTED AREA, REQUIRING THE POSTING OF SAID RESTRICTED AREA BY SIGNS AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS.

The Board of Supervisors of the Township of East Norriton, Montgomery County, Pennsylvania, do hereby ordain and enact:

SECTION 1. No commercial vehicles as hereinafter defined shall be permitted to traverse and use such restricted township roads or portion thereof as said Supervisors shall designate by resolution when deemed necessary and appropriate for the public health, safety or welfare.

SECTION 2. Commercial vehicles shall include all motor vehicles other than passenger vehicles and public transportation passenger vehicles with a gross weight in excess of 4000 lbs. Said commercial vehicles may use said restricted township roads when rendering necessary or routine services to occupants of said restricted area without violating this ordinance.

SECTION 3. The proper officers of the Township are hereby authorized and directed to erect and maintain the appropriate official signs designating the restricted township roads as provided under this ordinance.

SECTION 4. Any persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall upon summary conviction, before a Justice of the Peace, be sentenced to pay a fine not exceeding \$50.00 and costs of prosecution, and in default of the payment thereof shall undergo imprisonment for not more than five days in the Montgomery County Prison.
