

ORDINANCE NO. 275

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE REGULATION OF TRAFFIC AND PARKING IN THE TOWNSHIP OF EAST NORRITON, COUNTY OF MONTGOMERY, COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA, PURSUANT TO 75 P.S. § 101 ET SEQ., AND PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF SAID PROVISIONS

ARTICLE I
General Provisions

§ 196-1. Definitions and interpretation.

- A. Words and phrases, when used in this chapter, except for sections or Articles to which different or additional definitions apply, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the Vehicle Code, 75 Pa.C.S.A. § 101 et seq. (the Act of June 17, 1976, P.L. 162, No. 81), as amended, except that in this chapter the word "street" may be used interchangeably with the word "highway" and shall have the same meaning as the word "highway" as defined in the Vehicle Code.
- B. The term "legal holidays," as used in this chapter, shall mean and include New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day.
- C. In this chapter, the singular shall include the plural, the plural shall include the singular, and the masculine shall include the feminine.

§ 196-2. Manner of adopting permanent traffic and parking regulations.

All traffic and parking regulations of a permanent nature shall be enacted as ordinances or as parts of ordinances or as amendments to ordinances of the Township of East Norriton.

§ 196-3. Temporary and emergency regulations.

- A. The duly authorized law enforcement official shall have the following powers to regulate traffic and parking temporarily and in time of emergency:
 - (1) In the case of fire, flood, storm or other emergency, to establish temporary traffic and/or parking regulations.
 - (2) In the case of emergency public works or public events of limited scope or duration, to restrict or prohibit traffic and/or parking in limited areas for periods of not more than seventy-two (72) hours.

- B. These temporary and emergency regulations shall be enforced by the duly authorized law enforcement official and the police in the same manner as permanent regulations. Any person who drives or parks a vehicle in violation of any such regulation or who shall move, remove, destroy, injure or deface any sign or marking erected, posted or made to give notice of any such regulation shall, upon conviction thereof, be liable to the penalty set forth in the law or elsewhere in this chapter for a violation of such nature.

§ 196-4. Experimental regulations.

- A. The Board of Supervisors may, from time to time, designate places upon and along the streets in the township where, for a period of not more than ninety (90) days, specific traffic and/or parking regulations, prohibitions and restrictions shall be in force and effect and shall designate those locations by proper signs and markings. Such regulations, prohibitions and restrictions shall be effective just as if they had been specified in this chapter. No person shall drive or park a vehicle in violation of any such regulation, prohibition or restriction, and no person shall move, remove, destroy or deface any sign or marking erected, posted or made by authority of this section. Any person who violates any provision of this section shall, upon conviction, be liable to the penalty set out in the law or elsewhere in this chapter for a violation of such nature.
- B. The purpose of this section is to allow for test and experimental determination of the feasibility and desirability of permanent changes in the ordinances of the township relative to traffic and parking.

§ 196-5. Streets closed or restricted for construction, maintenance or special events.

- A. The Board of Supervisors shall have authority to close any street or specific part of a street to vehicular traffic and to place barriers or station police officers at each end of the closed portion while construction or maintenance work is under way or a special event is being conducted on the closed portion. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle upon any such closed portion.
- B. The Board of Supervisors shall have authority to establish a restricted traffic area upon any street where construction or maintenance work is under way and to station flagmen at each end of the restricted portion. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle upon any such restricted traffic area at any time when the flagman is displaying a sign directing that vehicle to stop or is signaling that vehicle, by a flag or other device, not to proceed.

§ 196-6. Authority of police officers.

The police shall have authority to direct traffic on the streets in the township, at intersections in public and in other places where the Vehicle Code or this chapter applies.

**ARTICLE II
Traffic Regulations**

§ 196-7. Speed limits.

The maximum speed at which vehicles may proceed on or along any streets or highways within the township is hereby established at twenty-five (25) miles per hour, except for any state or county highway or roadway and except that the speed limit for vehicles proceeding on or along those streets or parts of streets described in Schedule I (§ 196-42) shall be as indicated in said schedule.

§ 196-8. Traffic control signals.

Traffic control signals shall be installed and operated (or are ratified if previously installed) at the intersection of those streets described in Schedule II (§ 196-43), attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 196-9. Prohibited right turns on red signal.

No person shall make a right turn (or a left turn from a one-way street into another one-way street) when facing a steady red signal at any of the locations described in Schedule III (§ 196-44), attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 196-10. Prohibited turns at intersections.

It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to make a turn of the kind designated (left, right, all) at any of the intersections described in Schedule IV (§ 196-45), attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 196-11. U-turns.

It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to make a U-turn on any of the streets or parts of streets described in Schedule V (§ 196-46), attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 196-12. One-way streets.

The streets or parts of streets described in Schedule VI (§ 196-47), attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as one-way streets in the direction indicated, and it shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle on any one-way street other than in the direction established for traffic on that street.

§ 196-13. No-passing zones.

No-passing zones are hereby established along those streets or parts of streets described in Schedule VII (§ 196-48), attached to and made a part of this chapter, and it shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to overtake or pass another vehicle or to drive on the left side of the roadway in any no-passing zone described in said schedule.

§ 196-14. Stop intersections.

The intersections described in Schedule VIII (§ 196-49), attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby established as stop intersections, and official stop signs shall be erected (or are ratified if previously erected) in such a position upon the first-named street as to face traffic approaching the second-named street in the direction or directions indicated in said schedule. Every driver of a vehicle approaching any such intersection upon the first-named street, in the direction or directions indicated in each case, shall come to a full stop before entering any such intersection.

§ 196-15. Yield intersections.

The intersections described in Schedule IX (§ 196-50), attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby established as yield intersections, and official yield signs shall be erected (or are ratified if previously erected) in such a position upon the first-named street as to face traffic approaching the second-named street in the direction or directions indicated. Every driver of a vehicle approaching any such intersection upon the first-named street, in the direction or directions indicated in each case, shall slow down or stop the vehicle and then yield the right-of-way to any vehicle in the intersection or approaching on the second-named street so closely as to constitute a hazard during the time that the driver is moving across or within such intersection.

§ 196-16. Closing of certain streets to certain vehicles.

It shall be unlawful for any person to drive any vehicle, except a passenger vehicle (but not including any passenger vehicle drawing any trailer or towing any other vehicle), upon any of the streets or parts of streets described in Schedule X (§ 196-51), attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 196-17. Vehicle weight limits.

It shall be unlawful for any person to drive any commercial vehicle or other tractor, trailer or tractor-trailer combination, having a gross weight in excess of that respectively prescribed, upon any of the streets or bridges, or portions thereof, described in Schedule XI (§ 196-52), attached to and made a part of this chapter, except for the purpose of making local deliveries on said streets.

**ARTICLE III
Parking Regulations**

§ 196-18. Vehicles to be parked within marked spaces.

Wherever a space is marked off on any street for the parking of an individual vehicle, every vehicle parked there shall be parked wholly within the lines bounding that space, and it shall be a violation of this Article for any person to park a vehicle or allow it to remain parked otherwise.

§ 196-19. Manner of parking.

- A. Every vehicle which is standing or parked on a two-way highway shall be positioned parallel to either the curb or the edge of the highway and in all cases in the direction of authorized traffic movement. The vehicles shall be parked such that the right-hand wheels are within twelve (12) inches of the right-hand curb or, in the absence of a curb, as close as practicable to the right edge of the right-hand shoulder.
- B. Every vehicle which is standing or parked on a one-way highway shall be positioned parallel to the curb or edge of the highway in the direction of authorized traffic movement. Said vehicle shall be parked so that its wheels are within twelve (12) inches from the curb or, in the absence of a curb, as close as practicable to the shoulder of the road.

§ 196-20. Parking of commercial equipment.

- A. No commercial equipment, including but not limited to trucks, tandems [in excess of one (1) ton capacity], tractor-trailers, tractors or other commercial construction or cargo-moving vehicles or equipment, shall be parked upon any highway or street within the Township of East Norriton. Furthermore, no commercial equipment as described in this subsection shall be parked or stored upon any highway or street in the Township of East Norriton after completion of the working day.
- B. The following are exceptions to the restrictions set forth in this section:
 - (1) Any commercial equipment described in this section may legally park for the purpose of delivering goods or rendering services during the normal course of business, provided that such vehicle does not substantially impede the flow of vehicular traffic.
 - (2) Vehicles being used for the purpose of road construction shall be permitted to park, stand or stop on any highway or street within the Township of East Norriton when construction is in progress upon said highway or street.

§ 196-21. Angle parking.

No person shall park a vehicle upon any of the streets or parts thereof described in Schedule XII (§ 196-53), attached to and made a part of this chapter, except at the angle designated and only within the painted stall lines. On all streets or portions thereof where angle parking is now or shall hereafter be authorized, all vehicles parked thereon shall be parked with the front thereof nearest the curb.

§ 196-22. Parking prohibited at all times.

No person shall park a vehicle at any time upon any of the streets or parts thereof described in Schedule XIII (§ 196-54), attached to and made a part of this chapter.

§ 196-23. Parking prohibited certain hours.

No person shall park a vehicle upon any of the streets or parts of streets described in Schedule XIV (§ 196-55), attached to and made a part of this chapter, during the hours specified in said schedule, on any day except Saturdays, Sundays and holidays.

§ 196-24. Time limit parking.

No person shall park a vehicle or allow the same to remain parked upon any of the streets or parts of streets described in Schedule XV (§ 196-56), attached to and made a part of this chapter, between the hours specified, for longer than the time indicated in said schedule.

§ 196-25. Special purpose parking zones.

It shall be unlawful for any person to park any vehicle or to allow the same to remain parked in any special purpose parking zone established in Schedule XVI (§ 196-57), attached to and made a part of this chapter, except as specifically provided for such zone.

§ 196-26. Penalties for parking violations.

Any person who violates any provision of this Article shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than fifteen dollars (\$15.) and costs; provided, however, that it shall be the duty of the police officers and of parking enforcement personnel of the township to report to the duly authorized law enforcement official all violations of any provision of this Article, indicating, in each case, the section violated, the license number of the vehicle involved in the violation, the location where the violation took place and any other facts that might be necessary in order to secure a clear understanding of the circumstances attending the violation. The police officer or other person making the report shall also attach to or place upon every such vehicle a notice stating that the vehicle was parked in violation of this Article. The notice shall contain instructions to the owner or driver of the vehicle that if he will report to the office of the Chief of Police and pay the sum of ten dollars (\$10.) [or, if the violation was of § 196-20, Parking of commercial equipment, the sum of fifteen dollars (\$15.)] within seventy-two (72) hours after the time of the notice, or if he will forward the sum of ten dollars (\$10.) [or, if the violation was of § 196-20, Parking of commercial equipment, the sum of fifteen dollars (\$15.)] by regular mail to the office of the Township Police Secretary, postmarked within seventy-two (72) hours of the violation, that act will save the violator from prosecution and from payment of the fine and costs prescribed in the first sentence of this section.

ARTICLE IV**Removal and Impounding of Certain Vehicles****§ 196-27. Applicability and scope.**

This Article is enacted under authority of Section 6109(a)(22) of the Vehicle Code and gives authority to the township to remove and impound vehicles that are parked overtime on any street in the township in violation of any provision of Article I or Article III of this chapter.

§ 196-28. Authority to remove and impound.

The township shall have authority to remove and impound or to order the removal and impounding of any vehicle parked overtime or otherwise illegally, provided that the circumstances of its parking were within the conditions stated in § 196-27 of this Article and provided that no such vehicle shall be removed or impounded except in strict adherence to the provisions of this Article.

§ 196-29. Designation of approved storage garages; bonding; towing and storage.

Removal and impounding of vehicles under this Article shall be done only by approved storage garages that shall be designated from time to time by the Board of Supervisors. Every such garage shall submit evidence to the Board of Supervisors that it is bonded or has acquired liability insurance in an amount satisfactory to the Board of Supervisors as sufficient to indemnify owners of impounded vehicles against loss or damage to those vehicles while in the custody of the garagekeeper for the purpose of towing or storage. The approved storage garage shall submit to the Board of Supervisors its schedule of charges for towing and storage of vehicles under this Article, and when the schedule is approved by the Board of Supervisors, those charges shall be adhered to by the approved storage garage. No different schedule of charges shall be adopted without approval of the Board of Supervisors, and no different charges shall be demanded of or collected from any person whose vehicle is removed or impounded under this Article by any approved storage garage. The Board of Supervisors shall delete from its list of approved storage garages any garage that makes any unapproved charge in connection with any vehicle removed or impounded under this Article.

§ 196-30. Notification of removal and impounding.

Within twelve (12) hours from the time of removal of any vehicle under authority granted by this Article, notice of the fact that the vehicle was removed shall be sent by the township to the owner of record of the vehicle. The notice shall designate the place from which the vehicle was removed, the reason for its removal and impounding and the garage in which it was impounded.

§ 196-31. Effect of payment of towing and storage charges.

The payment of any towing and storage charges authorized by this Article shall, unless payment is made under protest, be final and conclusive and shall constitute a waiver of any right to recover the money so paid. If payment of any towing or storage charges is made under protest, the offender shall be entitled to a hearing before a District Justice. Payment of towing and storage charges shall not relieve the owner or driver of any vehicle from liability for any fine or penalty for the violation of the provision of this chapter for which the vehicle was removed or impounded.

§ 196-32. Records of vehicles removed and impounded.

The township shall cause a record to be kept of all vehicles impounded under this Article and shall be able at all reasonable times to furnish the owners or the agents of the owners of those vehicles with information as to the place of storage of the vehicle.

§ 196-33. Restrictions upon removal of vehicles.

No vehicle shall be removed under the authority of this Article if, at the time of the intended removal, the owner or the person for the time being in charge of the vehicle is present and expresses a willingness and intention to remove the vehicle immediately.

**ARTICLE V
Snow and Ice Emergencies**

§ 196-34. Declaration of snow and ice emergency.

In order to facilitate the movement of traffic and to combat the hazards of snow and ice on the snow emergency routes named pursuant to § 196-36 of this Article, the duly authorized law enforcement official, in his discretion, may declare a snow and ice emergency (designated in this Article as a "snow emergency"). Information on the existence of a snow emergency may be given by the township through radio, newspaper or other available media, and information on the termination of the emergency may be given by use of the same media.

§ 196-35. Parking and driving restrictions.

After any snow emergency is declared, it shall be unlawful, at any time during the continuance of the emergency, for any person:

- A. To park a motor vehicle or to allow that vehicle to remain parked anywhere on any snow emergency route designated pursuant to § 196-36; or
- B. To drive any motor vehicle on any such snow emergency route unless that vehicle is equipped with snow tires or chains.

§ 196-36. Snow emergency routes.

The streets or parts of streets described in Schedule XVII (§ 196-58), attached to and made a part of this chapter, are hereby designated as snow emergency routes.

§ 196-37. Penalty for violation.

- A. If, at any time during a period of snow emergency declared under § 196-34 of this Article, a person shall park a motor vehicle or allow a motor vehicle to remain parked anywhere upon a snow emergency route, that person shall be guilty of a violation of this Article and, upon conviction, shall be punishable as provided in § 196-26 of this chapter.
- B. If, at any time during a period of snow emergency declared under § 196-34 of this Article, a person shall drive a motor vehicle upon a snow emergency route without having that vehicle equipped with snow tires or chains, that person shall be guilty of a violation of this Article and, upon conviction, shall be punishable as provided in § 196-33 of this chapter.

ARTICLE VI
Miscellaneous Provisions

§ 196-38. Violations and penalties.

Unless another penalty is expressly provided by the Vehicle Code (75 Pa.C.S.A. § 101 et seq.) or except as herein specified, every person convicted of a violation of a provision of this chapter, or any supplement thereto, shall be liable to a penalty of twenty-five dollars (\$25.) and costs of prosecution.

§ 196-39. Repeal of previous ordinances; effect.

- A. All previous ordinances of the Township of East Norriton pertaining to the regulation of traffic and parking are hereby repealed.
- B. The repeal of ordinances provided for in Subsection A above shall not affect or prevent the prosecution or punishment of any person for any act done or liability incurred in violation of any ordinance or regulation in force immediately prior to the taking effect of this chapter.
- C. The provisions of this chapter, insofar as they are the same as those of ordinances and regulations in force immediately prior to the enactment of this chapter, are intended as a continuation of such ordinances and regulations and not as new enactments.

§ 196-40. Severability.

The provisions of this chapter shall be severable, and if any of its provisions shall be held to be unconstitutional, illegal or otherwise invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of any of the remaining provisions of this chapter. It is hereby declared as a legislative intent that this chapter would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, illegal or otherwise invalid provision not been included herein.

§ 196-41. Effective date.

This chapter shall take effect after approval in accordance with the provisions of the Second Class Township Code.

**ARTICLE VII
Schedules**

§ 196-42. Schedule I: Speed Limits.

In accordance with the provisions of § 196-7, speed limits other than twenty-five (25) miles per hour are established as indicated upon the following streets or parts of streets:
